Lecturer on Conditions in Russia Tells of Demands Made on Those Who Join Party

EDMONTON, Dec. 16:-"Communists are not going out to get new members for their party. On the contrary, they make strong demands of people who wish to join their party," said Dr. A. F. B. Clark, of the department of modern languages of the University of British Columbia, at an exchange lecture given in Convocation hall on Thursday morning. The subtect of the lecture was "A Visit to Soviet Russia." Dr. R. C. Wallace, president of the university. introduced the speaker, who was thanked by Dean W. A. R. Kerr.

Four demands are made of any aspirant to entry in the Communist party, stated Dr. Clark, who spent some time in Russia a year ago. The first of these is that the man must be literary. In the second place he must prove that he has no religion, Communism itself is to be the religion. Any other religion is a rival to the doctrine of Communism and for that reason must not be tolerated.
