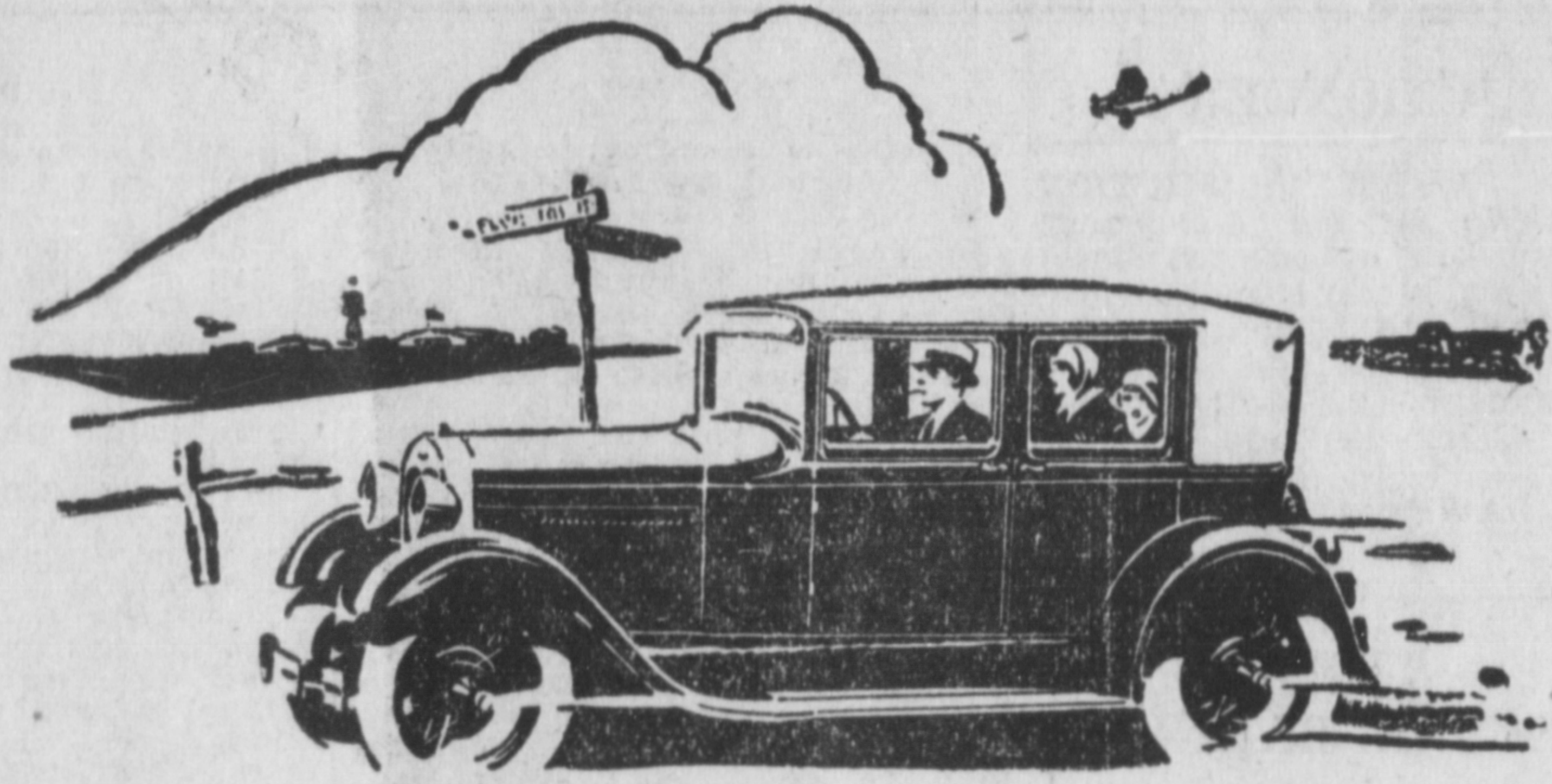

POTATOES ARE HIGH

General Crop Shortage Will Boost Them More This Winter; Eggs Are Firm

Prospects are that potatoes will be very high in price this winter. Indeed, they are beginning to advance now, which is rather unusual for this time of year, when normally local crops would be flooding the market. The situation is attributable partly at least to lack of potatoes on the prairies. Thirty householders would be well advised to lay in a supply of spuds now, even though the price is \$3.50 per hundred.

The egg market is firm and advances will soon be in order. Till the middle of November the price will be high, though no advance has yet been shown on the local retail list.

West Indies grapefruit is now on the market here. It may take the place this winter of Florida grapefruit which is being seriously affected by blight.

Many seasonal lines of fruits and vegetables are now disappearing from the local market with few replacements.

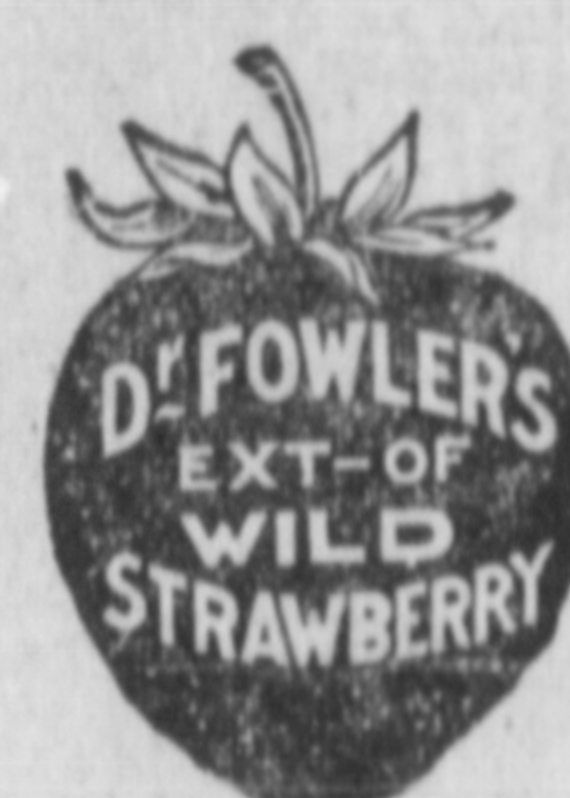
