WATER NOTICE

Notice of Appropriation and Storage of Water

ALASKA JUNEAU GOLD MINING COMPANY intends to apply for a license to divert, store, and use water, and in this connection, gives the following particulars:

BIG SHIPMENT OF GOLDFISH FROM JAPAN TO STATES

TOKIO, Oct. 11.—A shipment of 100,000 goldfish was recently sent from Japan to the United States from Koriyamachi, an old town in Nara prefecture. This is the first shipment of its kind on a large scale and may be the forerunner of many more owing to the recent increase in the demand for goldfish in Canada and the United States.

The government railway authorities were approached with regard to the manner of shipping the fish from their place of origin to a seaport, and inasmuch as two-thirds of the fish generally die on the way, the railway officials decided to ship them first class on the same trains carrying passengers.

The fish are said to be of the rarest and choicest species of goldfish, and are contained in 110 kegs of about 40 pounds each.


