

co-starring.

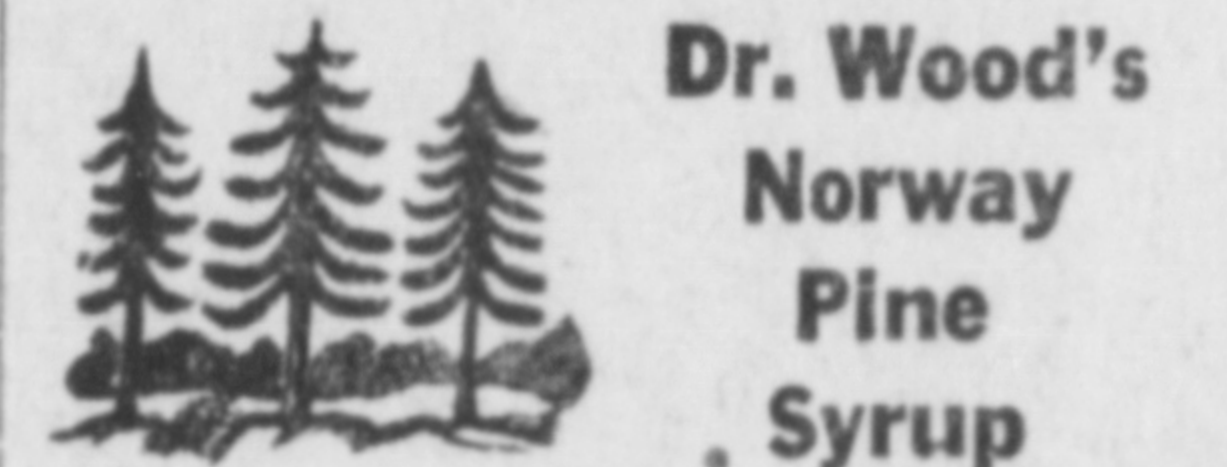
