

Veterans' Weekly Asks Equalization.

The government has ignored entirely the well defined demand throughout the country for an equalization of pensions of all ranks of the C. E. F., says the B. C. Veterans' Weekly. Many of the better class of officers have declared their approval of the equalization trict of pensions as asked for.

The conclusion reached is that a truly democratic spirit does not actuate the government. Its reluctance in the matter of the abolition of titles is one instance, and its ignoring the pensions equalization is another. The officers opposed to it are mainly those of the class who performed little or no real war service, of the kind who earned the contempt of the officers and men who were real soldiers.


