SHEFFIELD, July 6. — Rt. Hon. A. V. Alexander, first lord of the admiralty, alluding in a speech last night to the naval disarmament discussion between Great Briain and United States, said the people need have no fear that the Labor Government would sacrifice security in their haste for disarmament. He affirmed that the Labor administration would work with might and main for stabilization of naval armaments at a given point and then reduction which would give Britain security without the present drain upon her economic resources.

Whatever armaments the admiralty might require in future must be efficient, Mr. Alexander declared. He said he was sure the government would improve the tandards and not lower them.
