**Soldiers Who Served Overseas**  
DURING GREAT WAR.

Prince Rupert's Honor Roll Contains Many Casualties.

Prince Rupert district did a big share in winning the war. Practically all the boys that amounted to anything and who were fit went overseas. Over 500 served in the military or naval forces and many gave their lives for the cause.

Since peace has been declared it is a fitting time to take stock of those who did such noble service, and the appended list is as complete as it has been found possible for the Great War Veterans to make it. If there are any names missed the War Veterans would like to hear of them in order that their records may be complete.

Some of the boys lived in the outlying parts of this district prior to the war, but the vast majority were Prince Rupert boys. The following is the list:—
