FINE WEATHER PREVAILS HERE

Negligible Rainfall During Past Two Weeks; High Thermometer of Spring Yesterday



President Chiang Kai-shek of China, who has issued a proclamation at Hankow, declaring that he intends to resign as head of the Nationalist government. As a reason he says he blames himself for not having foreseen and prevented the Wuhan rebellion. He intends to travel abroad for rest and study, then return to China as a private citizen.

Prince Rupert is enjoying the 14th day today of an exceptionally fine spell of weather and prospects are that it will continue for a few more days at least. Yesterday afternoon the thermometer went up to 65, making the warmest day so far this spring. Since April 10 the fine spell has continued with only a trace of rain on one or two days. This is the seventh day of clear skies.

The month of April is going to set up a good weather record this year. There have been 125 hours of bright sunshine since the first of the month and not an inch and a half of rain. In the entire month of April last year there was 91.8 hours of sunshine and 5.21 inches of rain, the highest thermometer reading having been 60.

A steady barometer standing at 30.34 this morning with high humidity and wind in the north indicated the continuation of the present fine spell.

Weather here during the past week or so has been much better than in Vancouver, where it has been cold and cloudy with rain showers, wind and general unpleasantness.
