### MUCH ACTIVITY SEEN AT USK

**Crusher Being Installed by the Kitsuas Copper Co.—Mill Employs Forty Men and Will be Cutting Soon.**

Usk, August 9.—There was a dance here on Saturday night, the hall being crowded. There were three fiddlers, one of whom was a returned soldier, and some fancy stepping by another returned man proved interesting. About seventy were present.

The G. T. P. engineers have been surveying for a spur track to the Georgetown sawmill. There are about forty men employed at the mill and cutting lumber will soon commence. Logs are being cut.

There is a good supply of water here, a pipe line having been put in leading from a dam on the mountain side. A six or eight inch hydro-electric pipe line will be put in soon and then the place will be lighted by electricity.

Fishing is great. Peter Black, Jr., is spending a holiday here and is getting some good trout.

#### New Crusher.

The Kitsuas Copper Co. are installing a new crusher. They are less than half a mile from the track and the ore looks better than that from Granby. Many of the men who were working at the Prince Rupert drydock have come up here and are all busy. Men have been coming in faster than they can be housed and as a result sleeping quarters are somewhat cramped.

Mr. Table of Portland, Ore., has 160 acres of land here which he is subdividing and putting on the market for townsite purposes.

The Kleanza Copper Co. have started work on their large dam for developing electric power.

#### Road to Terrace.

The provincial government is building a road to Terrace, something that is badly needed. It will be a great convenience to the town.

Kenney Bros. has a strike at their mill, the men asking for an eight-hour day. The Georgetown and other mills are working their men eight hours.

Strawberries are plentiful but they will soon be all gone. They are selling here and at Vanarsdol at \$3.25 a crate. Most of the berries are sent east as better prices are obtained than are paid at Prince Rupert.

The Misses Durham saw a bear here a day or two ago. He was a big black fellow, but he did not stop to converse.

### NINE EMPTY CARS SUNDAY

**Much Fish Will be Shipped Immediately on Arrival of Rolling Stock.**

Yesterday morning there were a large number of fishing boats in from the banks waiting to sell their catches at the local fish wharves. There were only two fish cars at the disposal of the various companies and these were very eagerly sought after. Three more express refrigerator cars arrived by freight yesterday afternoon which made the total cars available five. Enough fish were bought to fill these cars and the other boats will have to wait until Sunday. In the mean time more boats will be continually arriving which will tend to lower the price. Some of the fishermen who were unable to sell their catches this morning talked of going to Ket-chikan, but they might be in just as bad luck there, as no one could guarantee the prices. Many have stayed here trusting that their fish will still be good, and that the market will be as high as it was yesterday.

Nine empty express cars are expected in on the train Sunday evening and this will very materially relieve the tie-up among the buyers as the fish can be bought and packed on the cars almost immediately.
