WATER NOTICE

Notice of Appropriation and Storage of Water

ALASKA JUNEAU GOLD MINING COMPANY intends to apply for a license to divert, store, and use water, and in this connection, gives the following particulars:

(a).—The name and address of the applicant is the Alaska Gold Mining Company, address Juneau, Alaska, with an office on the Manville Claims on the Northern bank of the Taku River, about four (4) miles Easterly from the mouth of the Tulsequah.
