NEW YORK, Aug. 9.—The most sweeping reaction in the history of the New York stock exchange which wiped out more than a billion dollars in quoted values in fifteen minutes trading today took place as a result of the panicky liquidation of stocks inspired by an unexpected increase from five to six per cent in the New York federal reserve rediscount rate, the last official blow at securities specula-

The mineral output for the first six months of the ear was \$35,256,-063, an advance of 7.8 per cent

over figures for last year. The tonnage output was 3,300,-000 tons, also higher than 1928. Dividends of over \$12,000,000 from well established firms are posted. Gold, silver, lead and coal
