"On Trial," Warner Bros.' latest and greatest murder mystery drama, comes to the Capitol Theatre tonight or a run of two days. 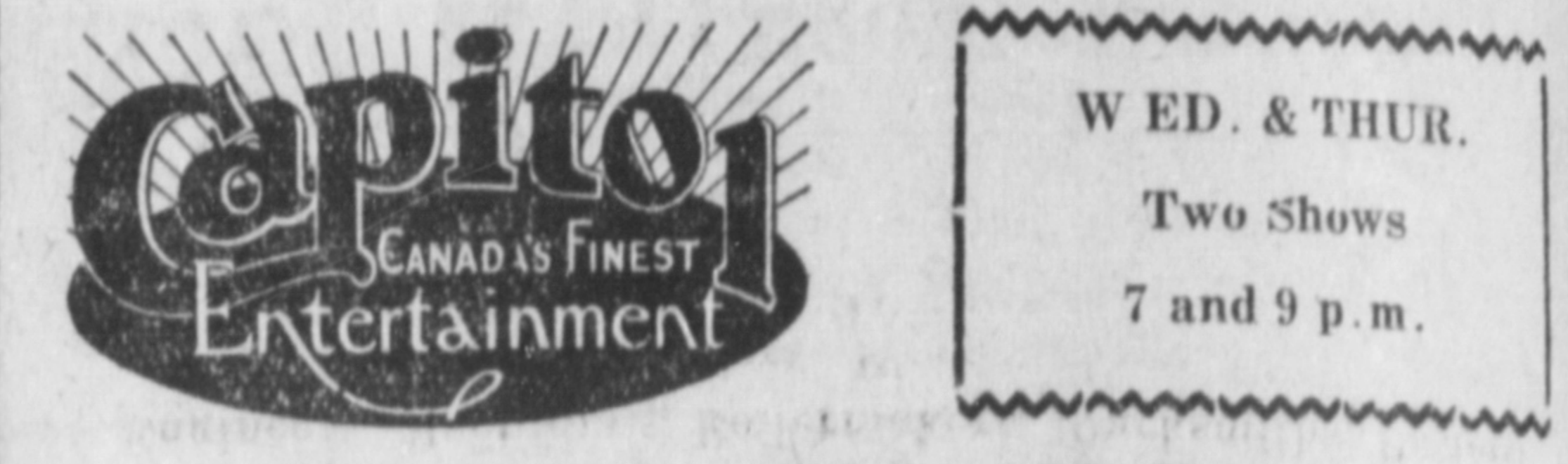
