

Scottish Savant Reads Paper at Meeting of British Association at Capetown

CAPETOWN, South Africa, eries, 13.2c and 8c. July 23.—At the meeting today of the British Association for the Advancement of Science, Professor George Barger, M.A., D.Sc., F.R.S., of Edinburgh, Scotland, president of the department of chemistry, delivered an address on the subject "The Relation of Organic Chemistry to Biology."

Professor Barger opened his address by dealing at length with the early difficulties of the chemical investigation of organic matter. Acids, he intimated, were available only in com-Aberdeen, South Dakota, who paratively recent times. Thus in 1770 only four acids were known in pure form and the number increased slowly. 
