Offer of France to Mediate in Manchuria is Refused by Soviet Consuls Are Refused Passports

MOSCOW, July 23.—France's offer to mediate in the Manchurian crisis has been declined by the Soviet Government, which assigned China's refusal to re-establish the status quo in Manchuria as the reason.

The Soviet ultimatum of July 13 demanded that China, preceding any conference to negotiate their differences, should release Russians imprisoned in Manchuria and cancel "illegal orders found issued in that province, particularly the seizure of the Chinese Eastern Railway."

TIENTSIN, July 23.—The Soviet consuls at Tientsin and Peiping were forced this morning to cance! their departure for Moscow with their staffs when they were refused visas for their passports by the commission for foreign affairs. It is understood the refusals were prompted by orders from Nanking on the ground that war had not been declared.

Tragedy Follows Wake of Bank Robbery when Man Killed by Shot

William Robertson Guarding Bridge at Telkwa When Rifle Swung Around by Boy Went Off by Accident and Killed Him

SMITHERS, July 23. — Tragedy has followed in the wake of the recent bank robbery here. At 6 a.m. today William Robertson was accidentally shot and killed by his son, Frank, aged 17, while they were guarding the bridge over the Telkwa River at Telkwa in connection with a bank bandit hunt.

Robertson was an old soldier and apparently was showing his son how he used to drill in the army. The boy swung the rifle around and accidentally discharged, the bullet glancing off Robertson's arm and entering the stomach just below the heart.

The father told the boy to get a doctor. When the doctor and son arrived the man was dead.
