New Planing Mill Phase of Development.

A new phase in the development of this port is seen in the steps being taken by V. Cowper Young to establish a planing mill in the city. This is an industry that is badly needed as is also the shingle mill which is to be operated. We have the lumber in the neighborhood and to have it manufactured ready for use right here is a big step forward. While the industry will not compare with the shipbuilding yard in the number of men employed, it will mean a steady payroll here all the year round. It will mean increasing prosperity to the merchants and better business all round.

Wants Tablet For Museum.

Harlan I. Smith, Dominion Archaeologist, asks for aid in trying to secure the recently discovered tablet at Kispix for one of the museums either at Victoria or Ottawa. Possibly the publicity which we are giving the letter may lead to the desired result. The letter is published on another page and is self explanatory.

Need of Museum in Prince Rupert.

As Prince Rupert is the centre of the whole of the northern and central portion of British Columbia some steps should be taken to lay the foundation for a museum here. If there were such an institution possibly sportsmen would be willing to donate trophies to it and Indian and other collections might be added from time to time.

The nucleus of a museum might be established in connection with a civic library, the librarian being also the custodian of the library. War trophies taken by north country men might be an important part of the collection, and the whole would soon prove to be of great interest to tourists and others who come this way. It would be one of the show places, and we have few enough here now.

A small art collection might well be a part of such an institution and enlargements of some of the fine local scenery photographed, would add to its value. The work of such men as Harry McLeod and others who specialize on typical northern scenes would prove of great interest. For instance, the use of rowboats for fishing will soon be a thing of the past. Then there will be no more strings of fishing craft towed out by tugs to the fishing grounds. Photographs of these would be interesting from a historic point of view.

Synopsis of Land Act Amendments

Minimum price of first-class land reduced to \$5 an acre; second-class to \$2.50 an acre. Pre-emption now confined to surveyed lands only. Records will be granted covering only land suitable for agricultural purposes and which is non-timber land.

PRE-EMPTORS' FREE GRANTS ACT.

The scope of this Act is enlarged to include all persons joining and serving with His Majesty's Forces. The time within which the heirs or devisees of a deceased pre-emptor may apply for title under this Act is extended from one year from the death of such person, as formerly, until one year after the conclusion of the present war. This privilege is also made retroactive.

SUB-PURCHASERS OF CROWN LANDS.

Provision made for issuance of Crown grants to sub-purchasers of Crown lands, acquiring rights from purchasers who failed to complete purchase, involving forfeiture, on fulfillment of conditions of purchase, interest and taxes. Where sub-purchasers do not claim whole of original parcel, purchase price due and taxes may be distributed proportionately over whole area. Applications must be made by May 1, 1920.

GRAZING.

Grazing Act, 1919, for systematic development of livestock industry provides for grazing districts and range administration under Commissioner. Annual grazing permits issued based on numbers of animals, priority established owners. Stock-owners may form Associations for range management. Free, or partially free, permits for settlers, campers or travelers, up to ten head.
