LABOR PLANKS OF LIBERALS

Part of Program Adopted at Big Conference at Ottawa Recently.

The planks in the Liberal platform recently formulated at Ottawa and having to do with labor matters are as follows:

"A—The introduction into the government of industry of principles of representation whereby labor and the community, as well as capital, may be represented in industrial control, and their interests safeguarded and promoted in the shaping of industrial policies.

"B—That in so far as may be practicable, having regard for Canada's financial position, an adequate system of insurance against unemployment, sickness dependence in old age and other disability, which would include old age pensions, widows' pensions and maternity benefits, should be instituted by the Federal Government in conjunction with the governments of the several provinces, and that, on matters pertaining to industrial and social legislation, an effort should be made to overcome any question of jurisdiction between the Dominion and the Provinces by effective co-operation between the several governments.

"C—The representation of labor on Federal committees pertaining to labor matters.

"D—Effective legislation for conservation of human life and health.

"E—The representation of labor on the board of directors of the Canadian National Railways.

"F—That the system of retraining soldiers unfitted for their past work because of physical injuries be extended to disabled workers in industry.

"G—More effective restriction of Chinese immigration.

"H—The Federal incorporation of co-operative associations.

"I—The acceptance of the principle of proportionate representation.

"J—Immediate and drastic action by the Government with respect to the high cost of living and profiteering.

"K—Restoration of the control of the executive by Parliament and of Parliament by the people through a discontinuance of government by orders-in-council and a just franchise and its exercise under free conditions."

The resolution was unanimously adopted.

The Vancouver Daily World refers to the finding of a carved sandstone tablet by road builders near Kispiox above Hazelton. While this may be of no value to the finders it probably is of real scientific usefulness and should be saved either in the Provincial museum at Victoria or in the archeological section of the Dominion Government collections in the Victoria Memorial museum building, Ottawa.
