## British Chancellor Once More Rejects Compromise Offers of Powers at Reparations Confabilities

THE HAGUE, Aug. 23.—British Chancellor Snowden this afternoon rejected new compromise proposals offered by France, Belgium, Japan and Italy to satisfy the British demands for an increased share in the German reparations.

French and Belgian spokesmen declared the new offers represented at least 75 per cent of the amount the British demanded. Chancellor Snowden, however, contended it was worth much less than 75 per cent.
