

## Ten Canneries Will be Operating on Skeena River is Announced

Some Changes Have Taken Place, but Number About the Same as Last Year; Three on Naas River

There will be about the same number of salmon canneries operating in District No. 2, of which Prince Rupert is the centre, this year as there were last, according to information which is now available. Three plants will pack on the Naas river and ten on the Skeena, as well as others on the coast south of the Skeena river. Managers PARSONS ON and machine crews have now arrived at practically all PARSONS ON these canneries to carry out work preparatory to the open-

ing of the season, which will not\* be in full swing until sockeye fishing starts about June 20.
