WHEAT IS HIGH GRADE

Nearly Forty Per Cent of This Year's Crop Goes No. 1 Northern

WINNIPEG, Oct. 15.—Milling, baking and protein tests which have been made to date in the new cereal laboratory of the Canadian Wheat Pool indicate that the principal grades of the new wheat crop are of excellent quality. The tests include a comparative study by grades of the inspection standards, the 75-25 outturn standards, the averages of inspections at the various inspection points, the average of terminal unload samples and the analyses of some 1,200 samples representative of all the crop districts in Western Canada.
