



Reports of Ald. Theo Collart and J. C. Brady M.P. on their recent attendance on behalf of the city at the convention of the Canadian Chamber of Commerce and excursion to the Peace River district, were accepted at last night's meeting of the city council and a vote of thanks tendered to the delegates; Ald. Dibb and Ald. Mac-, donald were named to represent the council on the special committee of the Prince Rupert Board of Trade on the Peace River outlet, and the matter of further financial assistance for the work of the committee this year was referred to the finance committee. It was also decided to recommend to next year's council that more substantial financial assistance be given publicity work which may aid in bringing the Peace River coast outlet to Prince Rupert.

Ald. Orme wished to congratulate the Peace River delegation for the fine work it had done. It would have been difficult to select a better delegation.

Ald. Macdonald agreed that the delegation had done exceedingly good work in the time at its disposal. As a matter of fact he knew of no committee in the history of the city that had done better work.

Ald. Dibb suggested that the rethanks tendered the delegation. He urged that a recommendation be passed on to next year's council that a more substantial amount of money be granted for publicity work of the kind that would keep Prince Rupert always to the fore as the Peace River outlet.




