#### FORWARD POLICY

Great Britain is adopting a forward policy with the idea of coping with the unemployment situation in that country. United States has also adopted a somewhat similar policy to stem the tide of business depression. Canada so far has taken no step to deal with a rather trying unemployment situation. In this connection we have two suggestions to make:

The Federal Government should build the western outlet to the Peace River country, commencing at once.

The Provincial Government should build the Skeena River Highway, commencing at once.

### Sport Chat

Rogers Hornsby, slugging second baseman of the pennant-winning Chicago Cubs, has been voted the National League's "most valuable player" for 1929. Announcement of his selection by the vote of a baseball writers' committee, of which James Crisberry of Chicago was chairman, came from the National League offices recently. It is the sixth and last official award by the league, carrying with it a bronze medal and cash prize of \$1000. Hornsby takes the honor for the second time and is the only player to repeat in either major circuit in this contest which, as a result of criticism of the selections, has now been abandoned by both the American and National Leagues.

Billy Townsend is to be sent after Al Foreman and that Canadian title from the first tap of the gong that sends them at each other tomorrow night in Vancouver. Joe McCranor, Townsend's manager, made that very plain when he said: "He's a going to box. I'm going to send him out there to fight. I think he would have taken Tod Morgan if he had been sent." "We'll touch New York before we return," said McCranor, "and we'll take any fights that we can get. Billy needs fights. He's as strong as a young lion and wants action."
