Ten Years Ago in Prince Rupert

March 8, 1919

On motion of J. D. McAuley, the Prince Rupert Board of Trade last night passed a resolution seeking the assistance of Lieut. Col. C. W. Peck, V.C., M.P. in having a lower freight rate given to lumber shipments destined from this district to Europe. A better rate, it is believed, would allow spruce mills of this district to participate in the overseas business.

The Board of Trade last night passed a resolution requesting the Dominion government to subsidize a small boat service out of this port. Reginald Beaumont was the mover of the resolution.

It is being urged here that Digby Island marine station be made, as was originally intended, a separate branch and not a sub-station to Victoria.

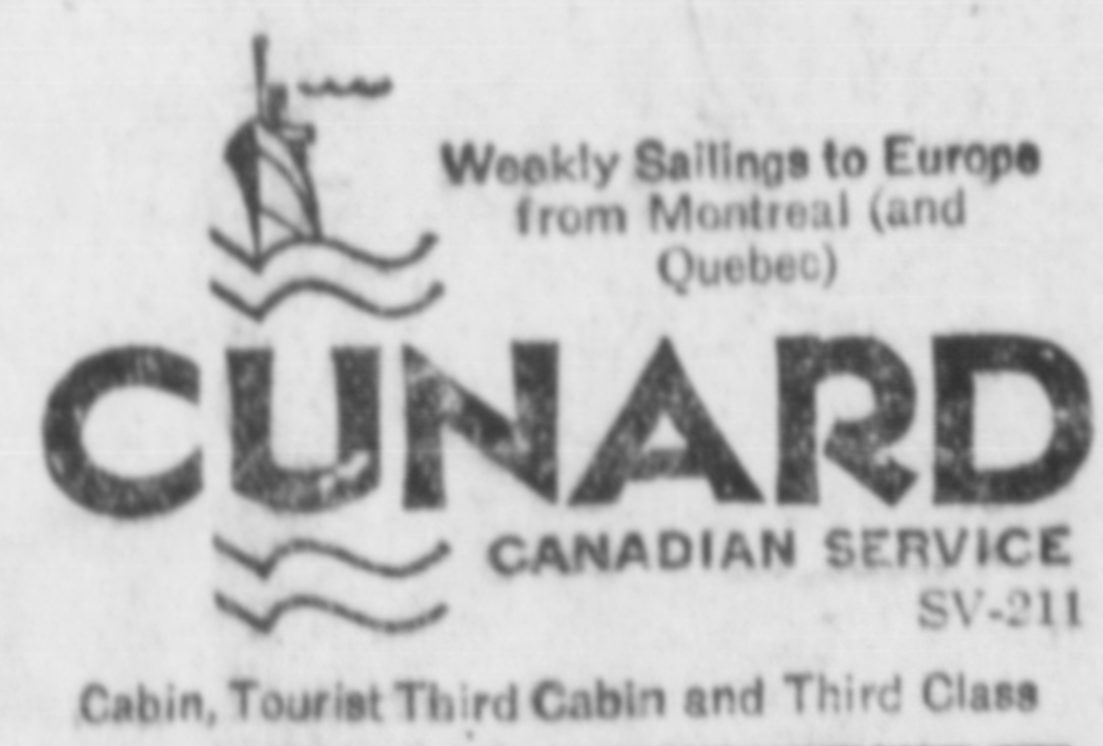

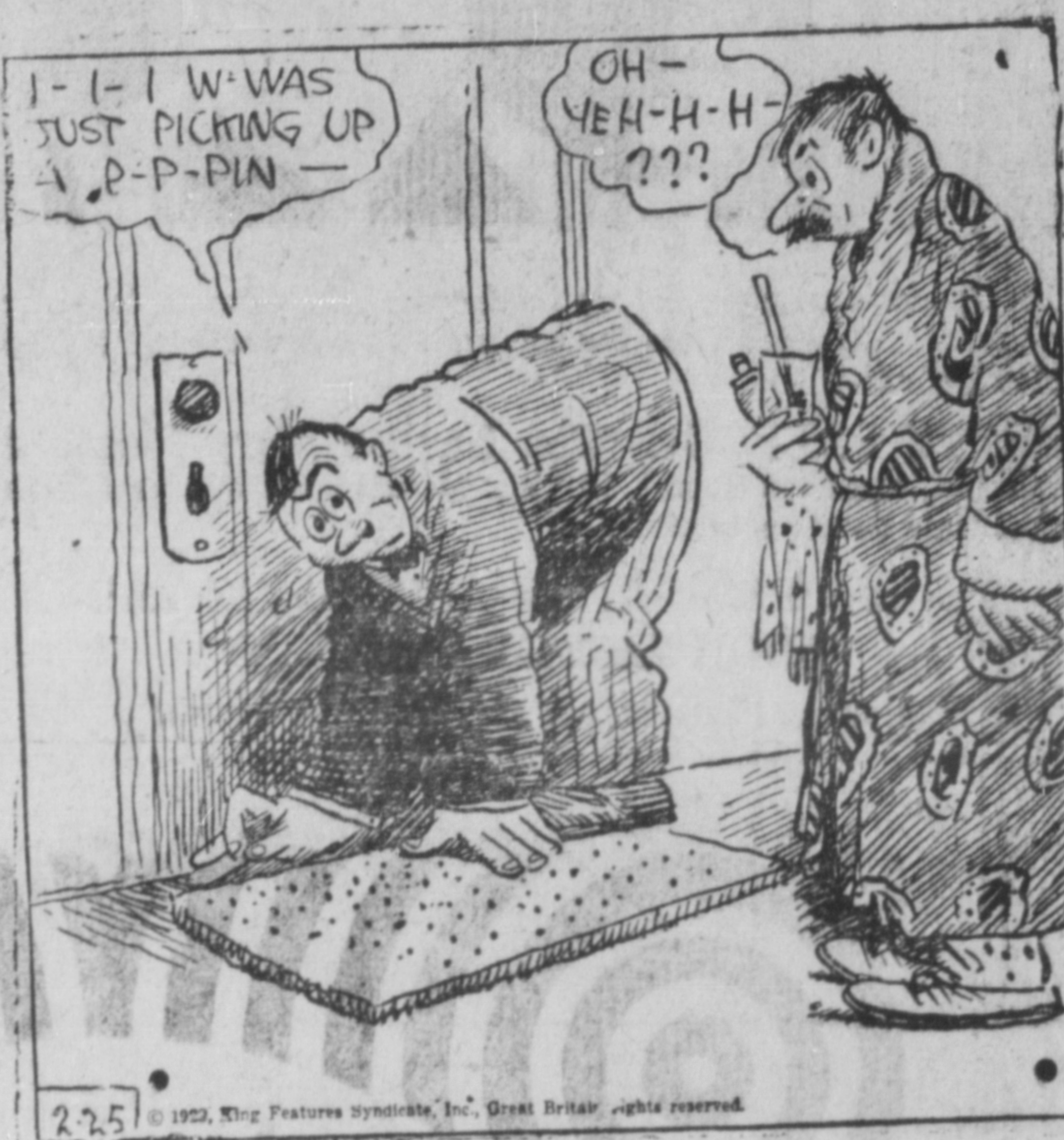
