C. C. Mills returned to the city on the Prince Rupert this morning from a ten day business trip to Prince Rupert. It is understood that Mr. Mills formerly manager for the F. G. Dawson Co. Ltd., intends to remain in Prince Rupert.

Amendments to the street traffic bylaw in connection with the placing of stop signs at the intersections of Fulton and Sixth Streets on Third Avenue were finally reconsidered and adopted at last night's meeting of the city council.

C. N. R. steamer Prince Rupert, Capt. D. Donald, arrived in port on time at 10:30 this morning from Vancouver, Powell River and Ocean Falls and will sail at 4 o'clock this afternoon for Anyox and Stewart, whence she will return here tomorrow evening southbound.

Out of respect to the late Hon. James A. Robb, whose death occurred on Monday, the flag over the local Post Office was flying at half mast this morning.

The regular monthly business luncheon of the Prince Rupert Gyro Club was held in the Commodore Cafe today. President L. W. Waugh occupied the chair.

The County Court case of William Goldbloom vs. Della Whitehead has been adjourned until November 29 with the prospect of a settlement being reached out of court before the action comes up again.

Owing to the illness of Thomas Brown, counsel for McRobbie, charges of obstructing and assaulting a police officer and of being under the influence of liquor while interdicted against George McRobbie and McRobbie's counter-charge of assault against Provincial Constable Gilker all were remanded for eight days on coming up before Magistrate McClymont in city police court this morning.

City Engineer Godd announced to the city council at its meeting last night that a native prisoner in the city jail had carved out a totem pole ten or twelve feet high which he was desirous of presenting to the city to be erected near the City Hall. The matter was referred to the board of works with power to act. The totem was carved out of yellow cedar and is a very creditable example of a fast dying native art.

At last night's meeting of the city council, Ald. S. D. Macdonald extended to Mayor McMordie the formal thanks of the Trades and Labor Council for co-operation and courtesies which had been extended by the mayor during the recent visit to the city of Tom Moore, president of the Dominion Trades and Labor Congress. Mayor McMordie stated that he had appreciated very much the opportunity of meeting Mr. Moore.
