## MINISTER ACCUSES BRADY PLAYING POLITICS

### Brady Accused by Minister of Public Works of Making Political Capital in House

Member for Skeena Resents Suggestion and Says He & Never Did This Either Inside the House or Out of It

OTTAWA, May 11 .- In the house yesterday Hon. J. C. Elliott, minister of public works, suggested that J. C. Brady, member for Skeena, was trying to make political capital in connection with the criticisms of the department made in committee of supply. Mr. Brady strongly resented the imputation. "I have never once in the house of commons or outside it, ever sought to make political capital out of it. I resent that from the minister of public works," declared Mr. Brady.

The discussion arose when Mr. Brady complained to the minister of public works that northern British Columbia was being neglected in the way of expenditures of this nature. He urged that consideration be given to the building of several wharves on Francois Lake, where none existed at present.
