## Sport

Many parties were organized over the week end for trips to neighboring beauty spots, but none could have been more attractive than Shawatlans Lake. There the salmon are trying to get up the falls in great numbers and are seen jumping all out in the inlet. Trout fishing is particularly good around the lower end of the lake amongst the big logs. Much success, however, was experienced by parties who took their boats right into the lake and fished up towards the head of the large body of water.

A word in season to the Callies. Unless they get out and train, and speed up their forward line, particularly in the inside right and left positions, there is likely to be a championship missing for the St. Andrew's Society shortly. The goods are there but the speed is not. Too easily are they stopped on the way down the field.

It is said that Hadfield, the New Zealand sculler, who won the Henley sculls and again won at Paris, is anxious to challenge Ernest Barry for the world's championship. Barry is quite prepared to defend his title this year, but, if a match is arranged, his opponent will more probably be Felton, the Australian.

A good many people interested in rowing have been puzzled to account for the fact that the Cambridge eight, which was defeated by the Australians at Henley after knocking out the Americans in good style, should have reversed the result in the Paris race. But several factors told towards this result. In the first place, the Cambridge men, though very good, were not quite at the top of their form at Henley. They had palpably lost a little of their "nip" when they met the victorious Australian eight after defeating the Yankees. After a fortnight's extra training on the Seine, the Light Blues came on wonderfully, and were an exceedingly strong combination. But in the second place, though good judges believe they could later on as they were rowing at Paris, have given the "Aussies" a much stiffer race and quite possibly a beating, in fairness it must be stated that three members of the Australians' Henley crew dropped out for the Seine race. This must have made a great deal of difference. Cambridge beat them decisively by half a length there.
