Month by month throughout the first nine months of the year, the Dominion Bureau of Statistics index of the physical volume of production attained higher levels than in any previous year. A like statement may be made for the indices of forestry, mining, manufacturing, domestic trade, and building. In agriculture, the prolonged drought reduced the wheat crop to only about 50% of the record volume attained in the previous year, but the small size of the crop was partly offset by a substantial improvement in grade.
