### In the Letter Box

#### COST OF LIVING.

Editor Daily News:—  
 You have given me the impression that you would welcome a discussion on the question of the high cost of living, therefore I submit the following letter, hoping you will be able to find sufficient merit in it to warrant you publishing it.

The first question I take up is: Is there a shortage of the necessary commodities?

I am satisfied there is not. My proof is that the merchants are trying to sell to other countries the commodities which are steadily rising in price, also that the different governments are reluctant to sell their war supplies to the public lest the effect should be to force prices down. Now some of them are compelled to sell to prevent the hoarding by merchants and cold storage companies, which proves conclusively that there is no shortage.

The next question I come to is: Does it cost more to produce the necessary commodities today than ten years ago?

I find by the aid of modern machinery that there is less labor power embodied in the production of commodities today than at any time during the world's history. Still the cost of living is soaring higher and higher.

#### Value of Dollar.

I must now investigate the medium of exchange which expresses the value of the commodities, known as the dollar. Has the dollar retained its purchasing power during the last ten years? I say "no." It has lost sixty per cent of its purchasing power, or in other words the dollar of today is only worth forty cents. This has been brought about by the financial system gradually getting away from the gold standard, increasing the credit system, and extending the circulation of promises to pay, which are worth about as much as the paper they are written on. In other words there has been a great financial debauchery, which marks the end of an unnatural system.

#### Boister Up.

There is a way of bolstering up this system for a short period, that is by bringing the dollar up to its original purchasing power, which can be more economically accomplished by altering the numbers on the dollar bills than by attempting to alter the prices of all commodities, as is proposed by the politicians.

The feasibility of this scheme can be judged by the fact that it is applicable to all countries under our financial system, as the same question predominates in those countries. It can also be carried out in any country and would solve the high cost of living question internally in that country. The exchange rate would regulate the foreign trade.

#### Will Mislead.

I wish the public to give the question full consideration, as it is for them to solve. Politician and profiteers will not try to solve it, but will attempt to mislead. I am prepared to go a lot further with this argument if necessary but I feel that I am already encroaching too much on the generosity of your paper.

Bids Were Opened Last Night and Referred to Public Works Committee.

Bids on painting the firehall were opened last night by the City Council and referred to the Public Works Committee with power to act. Three firms tendered on the supplying of paints, Kaiser Hardware Co., A. W. Edge and Silversides Bros. These were referred to the committee.

The tenders for the work were: Silversides Bros., \$346; Fred Scadden, \$360, and Jas. F. Martin \$165. Silversides' tender was conditional on the tender of the firm for material being accepted. They refused to work with material supplied by any other firm.
