PRINCE GEORGE LOG SCALE HOLDING UP

January This Year Was Behind 1928 But February Comes Up Again

The log scale for Prince George forestry district for the first two months of the current year amounting to 12,859,392 feet is down considerably from the record for the corresponding two months in 1928, the district's banner year. The January scale in the district totalled 4,635,484 feet as compared with January 1928 when 9,442,121 feet was recorded. The February scale, however, aggregating 8,224,508 feet was ahead of February 1928 when the total was 6,147,118 feet. Fir, spruce, cedar and balsam are the principal species of timber produced in Prince George district.

TWENTY YEARS AGO

The "Twenty Years Ago" column of the Vancouver Province on Tuesday recalled that "Dr. H. E. Tremayne, formerly chief medical officer of the Mountain Division of the G. T. P. Railway, was appointed Dominion quarantine officer with headquarters at Prince Rupert where a quarantine station will be erected on Digby Island." Dr. Tremayne is now attached to the quarantine station at William Head, out of Victoria.

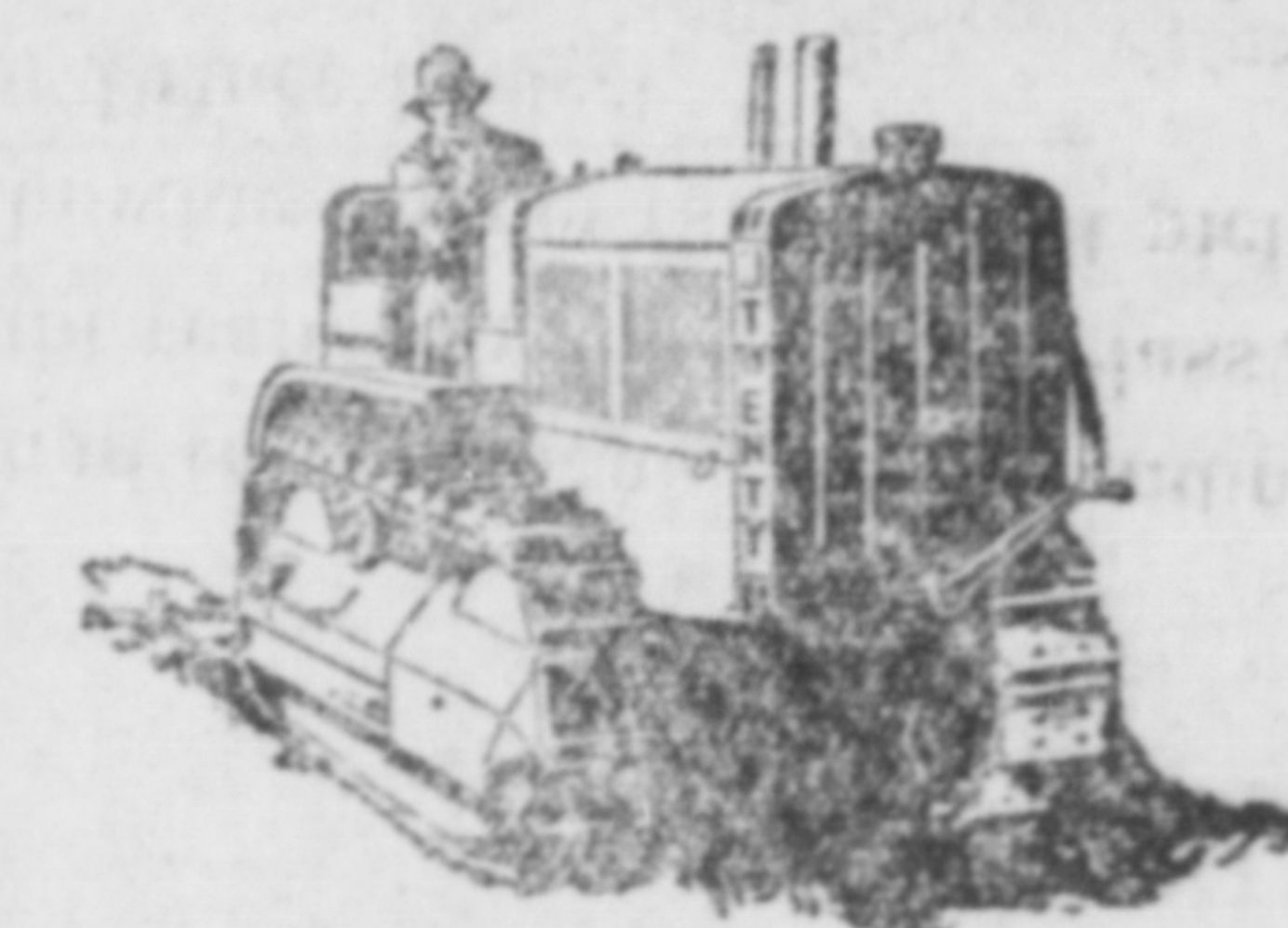

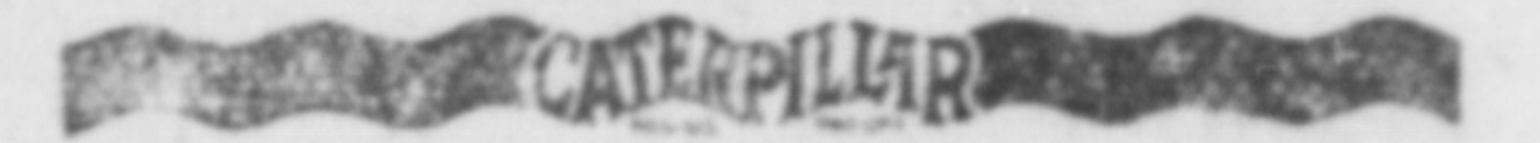

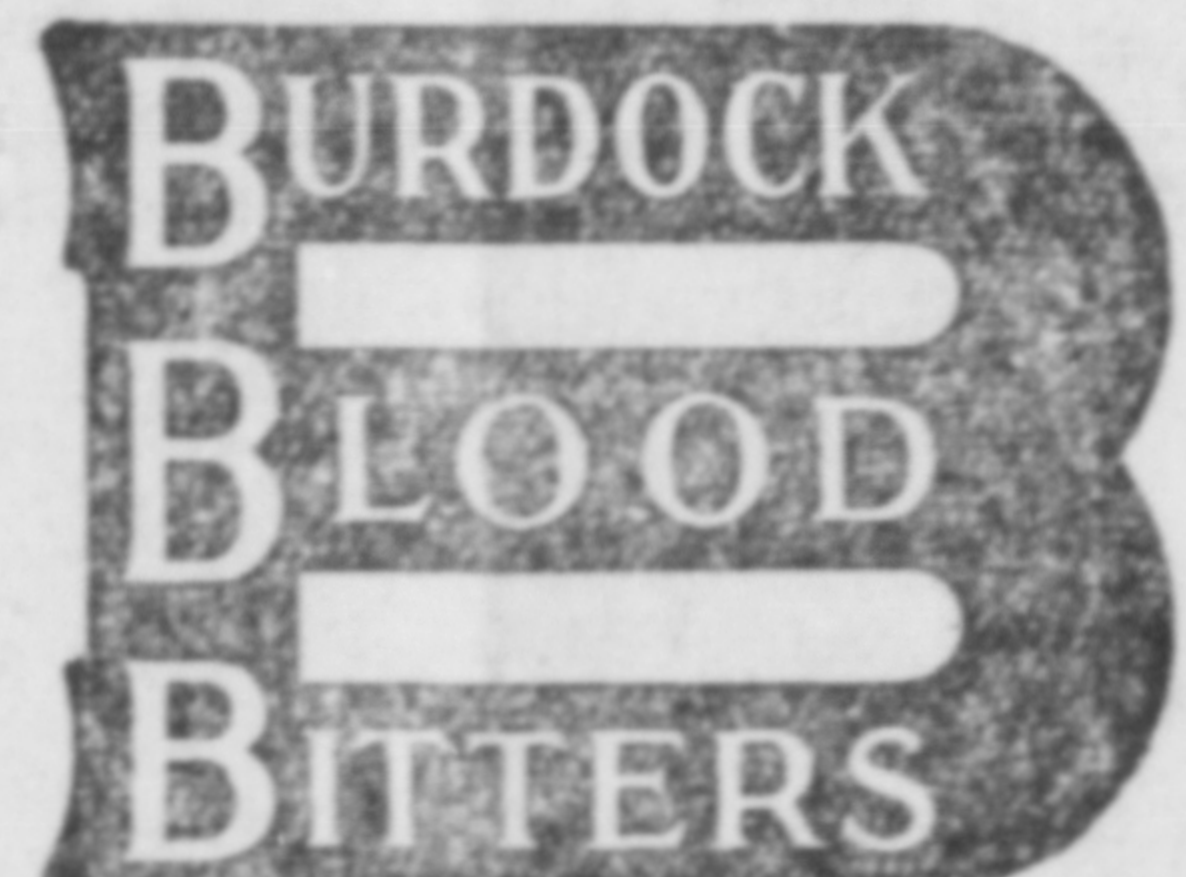
