Diversion and Use

TAKE NOTICE that Alfred H. Bryant, whose address is 609 Bank of Nova Scotia Building, Vancouver, B.C., will apply for a licence to take and use one thousand miners inches or 28 c. f. s. of water out of Buck Gulch Creek, which flows northerly and drains into Dease Creek about eight miles from Dease Lake.

The water will be diverted from the stream at a point about three-quarters of a mile from Dease Creek and will be used for hydraulic mining purpose upon the mine described as Ready Money Lease, Sunrise Lease No. 103 and Creek Claims Daisy and May stream.


