## Council Adopts Rate 45 Mils at Special Meeting Last Night

Details of Income and Expenditures in Budget of City for Present Year Showing Where Money of Taxpayers Goes

The city council at a special meeting last night finally adopted a tax rate of 45 mills for the year 1929. The estimates were under consideration and a few revisions were made in the interests of economy. The total expenditures for the year are estimated at \$310,069.39. Less receipts, expenditures classified are \$52,472.71 general expenditure, \$53,775 for schools and \$43,423.46 for special rates. The 45-mill tax rate is made up as follows: General, 16; schools. 16: special, 13, the special rate being to meet interest on outstanding city bonds which must be paid.
