

EASY TRAVELLING CON DITIONS FOR THE FISH

How can you expect a poor fish to get upstream to its spawning grounds, or a baby fish to go downstream from its birthplace, when it has to climb over a man-made dam? The above design of the Patent Office drawing of Frank W. Province's piscatorial escalator shows how the fish can be helped. It takes the shape of a cone, around which winds a flume which has a sloping floor. Apart from being of interest to the fish, it is also so designed to allow for the housing of turbines so that the water power of the "stair" may be converted into electricity.


