GETTING POWER OFFICE READY

City Light Consumers Will Pay Their Accounts Direct to Corporation Soon

The Power Corporation of Canada is getting its organization in readiness for the handling of the municipal light and power business. Offices have been established in the Exchange Block and, after this month, local consumers will go there to pay their bills.

While J. J. Little, former superintendent of utilities, is Northern B. C. manager of the Power Corporation, W. H. Wilson Murray, formerly of the City Hall staff, will be directly in charge of the office to the staff of which Miss Kathleen Stork and Miss Lorna McLaren have been appointed.

SLIGHT DELAY IN AUTHORIZING WORK LAYING WATER PIPE

A discussion took place at the city council meeting last night in regard to the laying of new water mains. It arose on a suggestion that tenders for the supply of pipe be opened. Alderman Brown suggested that the work should be done under a bylaw and that in the meantime the tenders be returned unopened.

Alderman Rudderham argued strongly for immediate action and after considerable talk it was decided to return the tenders and await the action of the Board of Works in regard to preparing the bylaw, it being pointed out that it was proposed to extend the scope of the work to include other streets. The estimated cost so far was \$6,000.

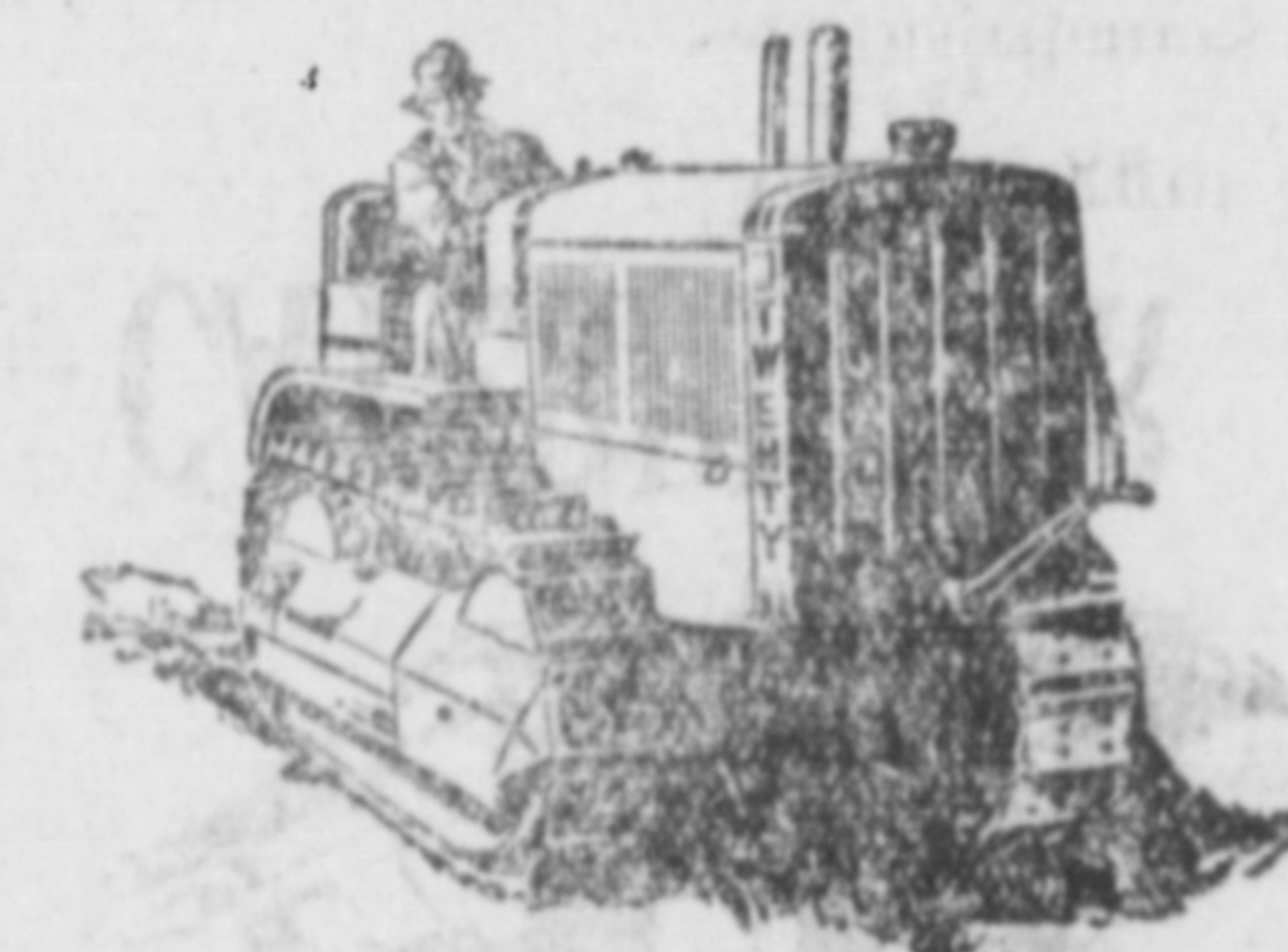

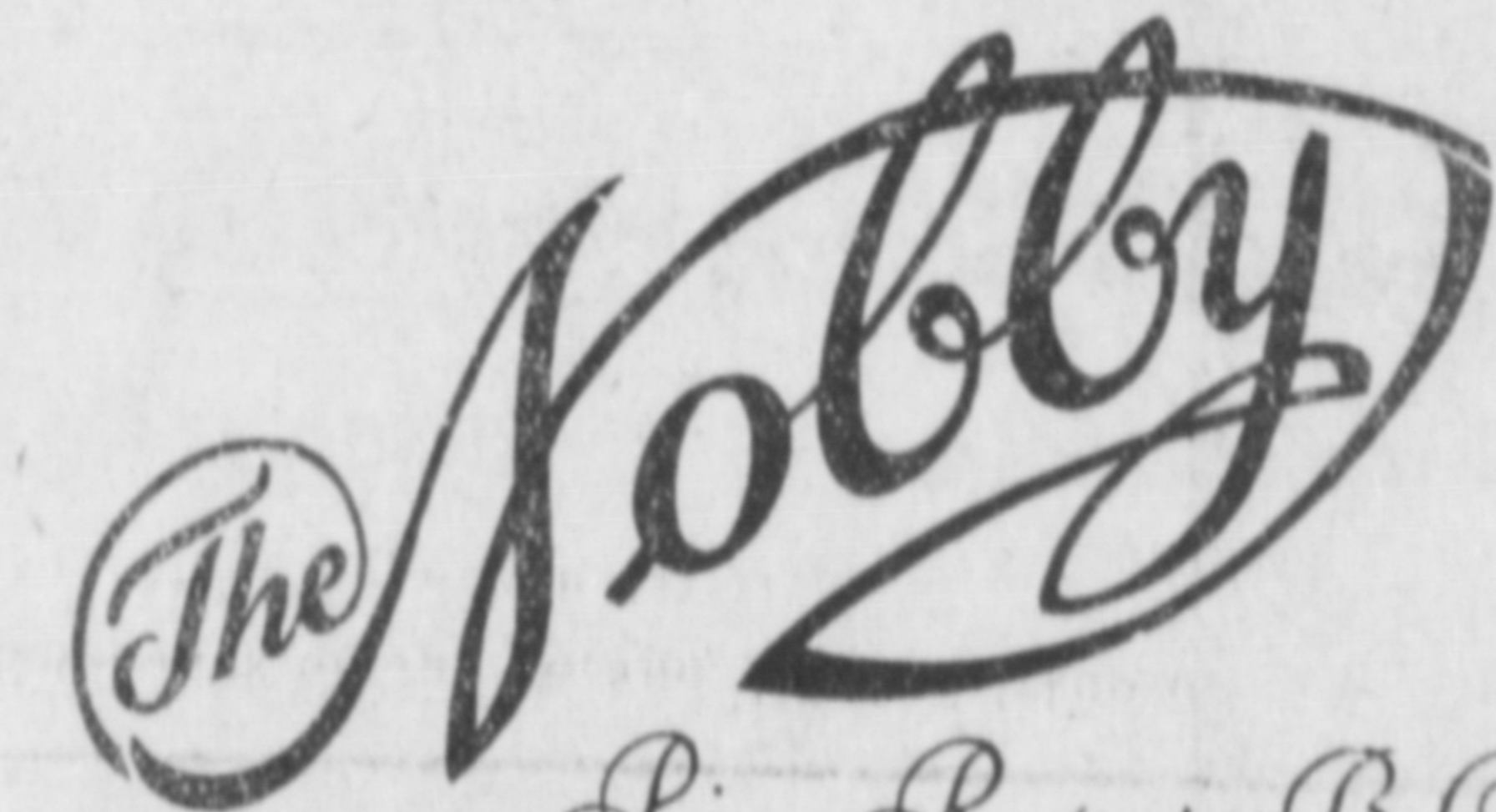
