Girl Receives Three Months

Daisy Chenoss of Hazelton Sent Down For Jail Breaking in Hearing at Smithers

On a charge of having escaped recently from jail at Hazelton, Daisy Chenoss, Indian girl, was sentenced to three months' imprisonment in County Court at Smithers yesterday by Judge F. McB. Young. On a charge of aiding and abetting her escape, Charlie Benson was dismissed.

The Chenoss girl will arrive in the city from the interior on this evening's train, accompanied by Corp. A. Fairbairn of Smithers, and will be taken on to Okalla aboard the Prince Rupert tonight accompanied by Staff Sergeant and Mrs. Alex McNeill. Reggie Rudland, who was sentenced a few days ago at Stewart to two months for wilful damage, will also be taken south tonight.

Judge Young, W. E. Fisher, who acted as crown counsel in the case at Smithers, and L. W. Patmore, who appeared for the defence, are returning to the city from the interior on this evening's train.

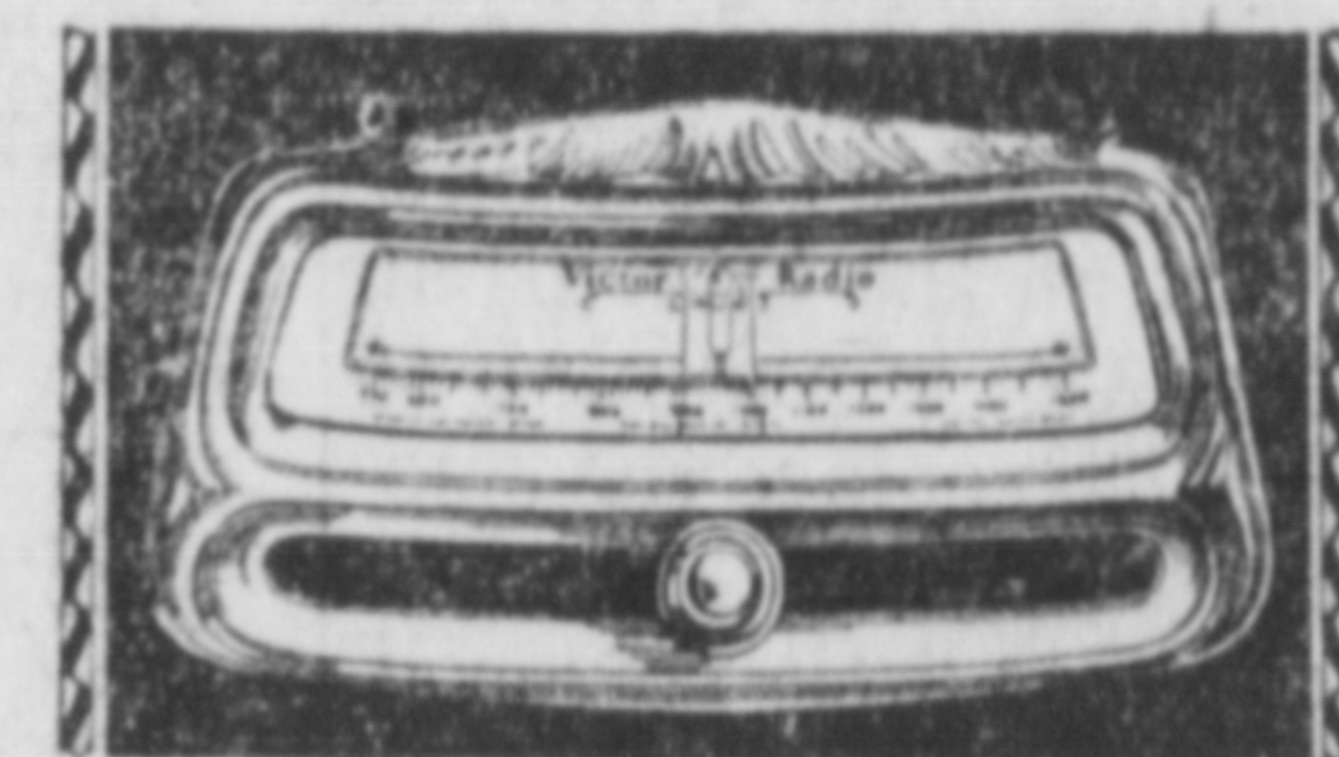
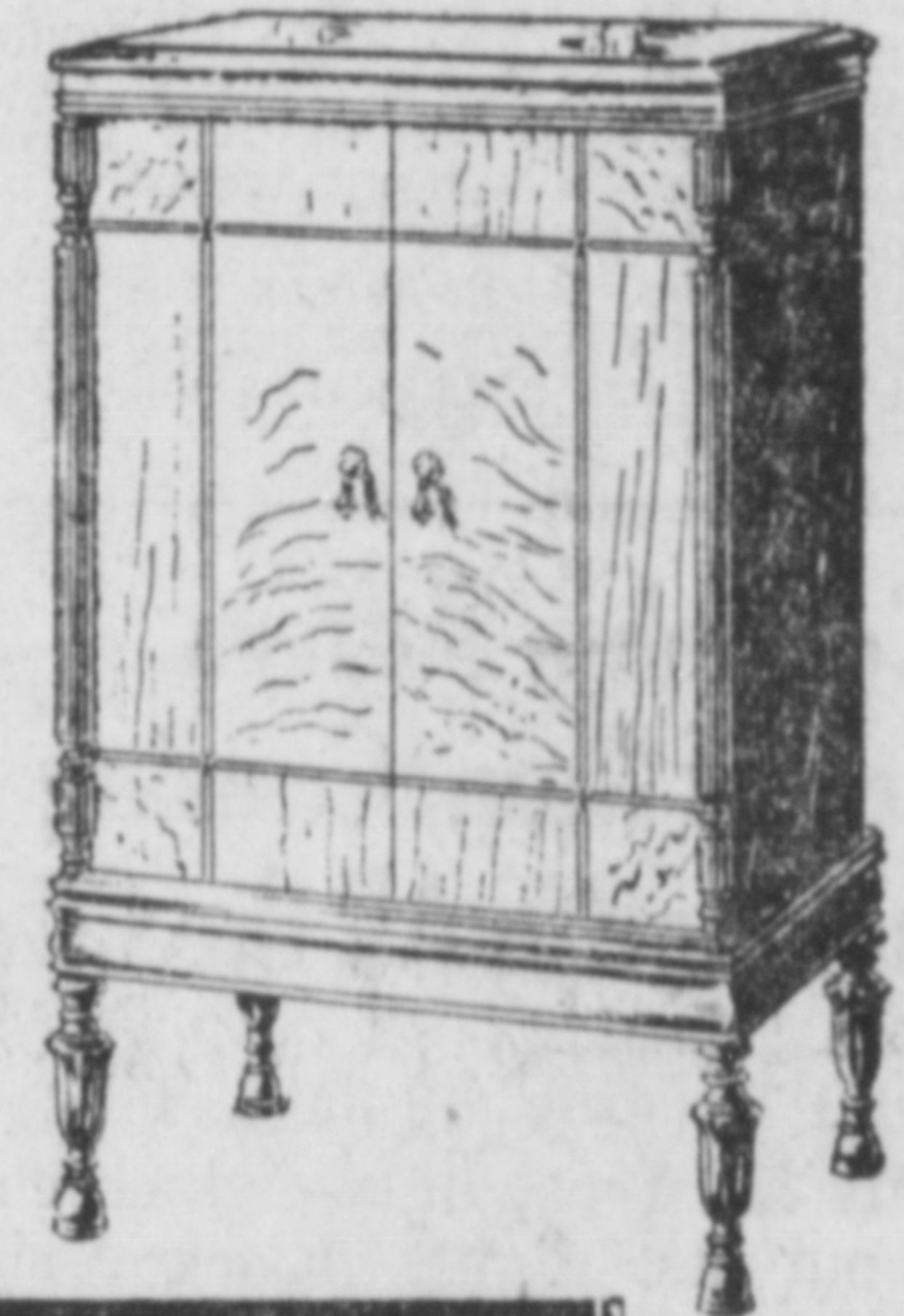
