### STORAGE OF X-RAY FILM IS DISCUSSED

Letter From Fire Marshal on Subject Read at Hospital Board Meeting Last Night

Storage and handling of X-ray films in the local hospital came up for decision at the monthly board meeting last night when a letter was read from J. A Thomas, British Columbia fire marshal, who stated that the matter was to be considered at a forthcoming Dominion fire prevention convention in Ottawa, with special reference to storage in hospitals, etc. Until more explicit instructions were given following this conventon, Mr. Thomas urged that in the meantime, the utmost care be observed. H. W. Birch, managing secretary, stated that an inspection had been recently made by Fire Chief D. H. Mc-Donald and a representative of the fire mershal and it had been suggested that no more than 1000 pounds or two years'
