ally promising Taku River area. "The conscientious and sincere effort of the departments of mines and public works emanating from their headquarters at Victoria, to assist in the healthy and stable development of the industry, and the encouraging co-operation with their servants in carrying out the work, is also a marked feature of the year's development."

"The Portland-Canal area has been exceptionally active, many properties have been energetically explored. It is interesting to note that mining exploration work will be continued on at least 12 properties during this winter, more than in any other former winter."

"It is of constructive importance for the future welfare of the Portland Canal area to note a decided tendency towards the realization that mines cannot be manufactured on paper, and that well-directed operations by capable mining engineers are essential for the efficient development of properties. This necessary tendency towards sound conservatism and the basic requirements of the industry is perhaps the most pleasing and constructive aspect of the 1929 mining activity in the Portland Canal area. More than anything else it will aid in promoting and stimulating activity in that promising section and in attracting necessary and sound capital for its development."

"During the latter part of the season operations were hampered by an incessant downpour of torrential rain that turned the best trails into quagmires and the most sedate of men into eloquently cursing mud-hens. Transportation in the area has, however, been considerably improved by assistance to trail construction on the part of the department of mines."
