Mr. McNulty, while in the south, made frequent visits across the Mexican border to Tia Juana and three weeks ago went down the west coast of Mexico to Ensenada to visit United States Consul E. A. Wakefield, formerly of this city. There were but the vaguest rumblings of war in that part of the country at least at that time. There was little talk about an impending conflict and no excitement. Of course, more recent developments may have made the air more tense. In any case, there is little fighting in that part of the country.


