LONDON, May 21. — The total number of candidates nominated yesterday was 1728, as compared with 1428 in 1924. The Conservatives have 596 candidates, compared with 514, with 536 in 1924. Labor has 571, as compared with 514, The and the Liberals have 514, as compared with 344. The Communists have 26, as compared with eight, and the Independents 21, against 26.

There will be 489 triangular and 33 four-cornered fights. Seven have been elected by acclamation.
