SHANGHAI, Aug. 19.—The Chinese Nationalist government has ordered the mobilization of ten additional brigades of Manchurian troops totalling 100,000.

The government views the Chino-Russian crisis as increasingly serious. The brigades will be assigned to duty on the northern frontier.

The Nationalist premier was quoted as saying that Moscow was trying to alienate the loyalty of the Manchurian provinces and declared: "The government is compelled to take a firm stand lest Communism again plays havoc in China."



Prince Rupert to Tokyo by Air



There is a scheme on foot, sponsored in Vancouver, for a trans-ocean flight from Prince Rupert to Tokyo, a distance of 3,770.6 miles, stopping for fuel at Kodiak Island, Unalaska, Attu Island and one of the islands of the Kurile group.

The flight is being financed by donations, each donor to participate in a number of prizes totalling in value \$10,000, the first prize being half that amount. The prizes are awarded for calculating the total flying time of the airplane "Prince Rupert," which is to make the flight. Each dollar donated gives a right to make a calculation.

The port of Prince Rupert is chosen as the hopping off point because it is only 3,770.6 miles from Tokyo, as against Vancouver's 4,283 miles.
