TURKEY TO BE CHEAPER

Massett Canned Crab Popular On Local Market; Egg Price Is Dropping

Turkeys for the Christmas market are expected to arrive in Prince Rupert next Monday. Housewives will be gratified to learn that the price will be lower than for several years. Other Christmas fowl is also coming in.

A new delicacy on the local retail market is snow cap sea crab meat packed by the Langara Fishing & Packing Co., Ltd., at Massett, Queen Charlotte Islands. No doubt this will be very popular. It will serve to replace Japanese crab meat and is ten cents per tin cheaper than that variety. It is said to taste practically like fresh crab.

Naval oranges will be coming in soon to replace Valencia which are almost over. Meantime, Japanese oranges are a popular fruit. Many varieties of winter apples are now being offered, the fall varieties being about done.

There has been a noticeable softening in the price of eggs recently, all classes being down. The flour, sugar and butter markets are steady with no changes.
