ESTIMATES OF SCHOOL BOARD

Educational Budget Includes \$84,055 for Ordinary Expenditure and \$5900 for Extraordinary

Estimates of the school board for the year 1929 presented to the city council at last night's meeting include a sum of \$84,055 for ordinary expenditures and \$5900 for extraordinary. An increase over last year is shown in each case, owing to the unexpected increase in school population. In 1928 the ordinary estimates were \$77,080 and the extraordinary \$1400.

The council has no option but to pass the ordinary estimates, but may, if it sees fit, pare the extraordinary appropriations. The estimates were referred to the finance committee.

BRASS BAND MET BISHOP AT MASSETT

Class of Seventy Confirmed at One Time and Choir of Thirty Sang

MASSSETT, Feb. 19.—On the last trip of the S.S. Prince John to the Queen Charlotte Islands, it arrived at Massett before daylight and the passengers were awakened by sounds of good music. On rising to investigate, they discovered the dock crowded with residents of the village who were accompanied by their brass band.

They were there to welcome the Bishop on his first Episcopal visit. A procession was formed which led the way to the church where formal addresses were read and a presentation made.

A communion service was held at 11 o'clock and a confirmation service at 2:30 p.m., when a class of candidates was presented, numbering seventy-seven. Perhaps, never in Northern B. C. was there a larger number of young people admitted to the church at one time, nor could there be a more interesting class both as to appearance and intelligence.

The evening's congregation filled the church to overflowing. At all the services there was a choir of about thirty which rendered several anthems in a most acceptable manner. The day will be remembered at Massett as one of the red letter days of its experience.

The "Twenty Years Ago" column of the Vancouver Province last Friday told how, on February 15, 1909, a thousand people gathered on the hills at Prince Rupert to watch a huge blast which was successfully fired on the Grand Trunk Pacific right-of-way. Some 80,000 yards of rock were moved, nearly forty tons of dynamite and black powder, costing \$15,000, being used.

COW BAY AGAIN IN LIMELIGHT

A letter from G. R. Naden, deputy minister of lands, which was read at last night's council meeting, requested the city to take the necessary steps toward giving its assent to the filling in of Cow Bay for permission to carry out which work the Canadian National Railways were now applying to the railway commission.

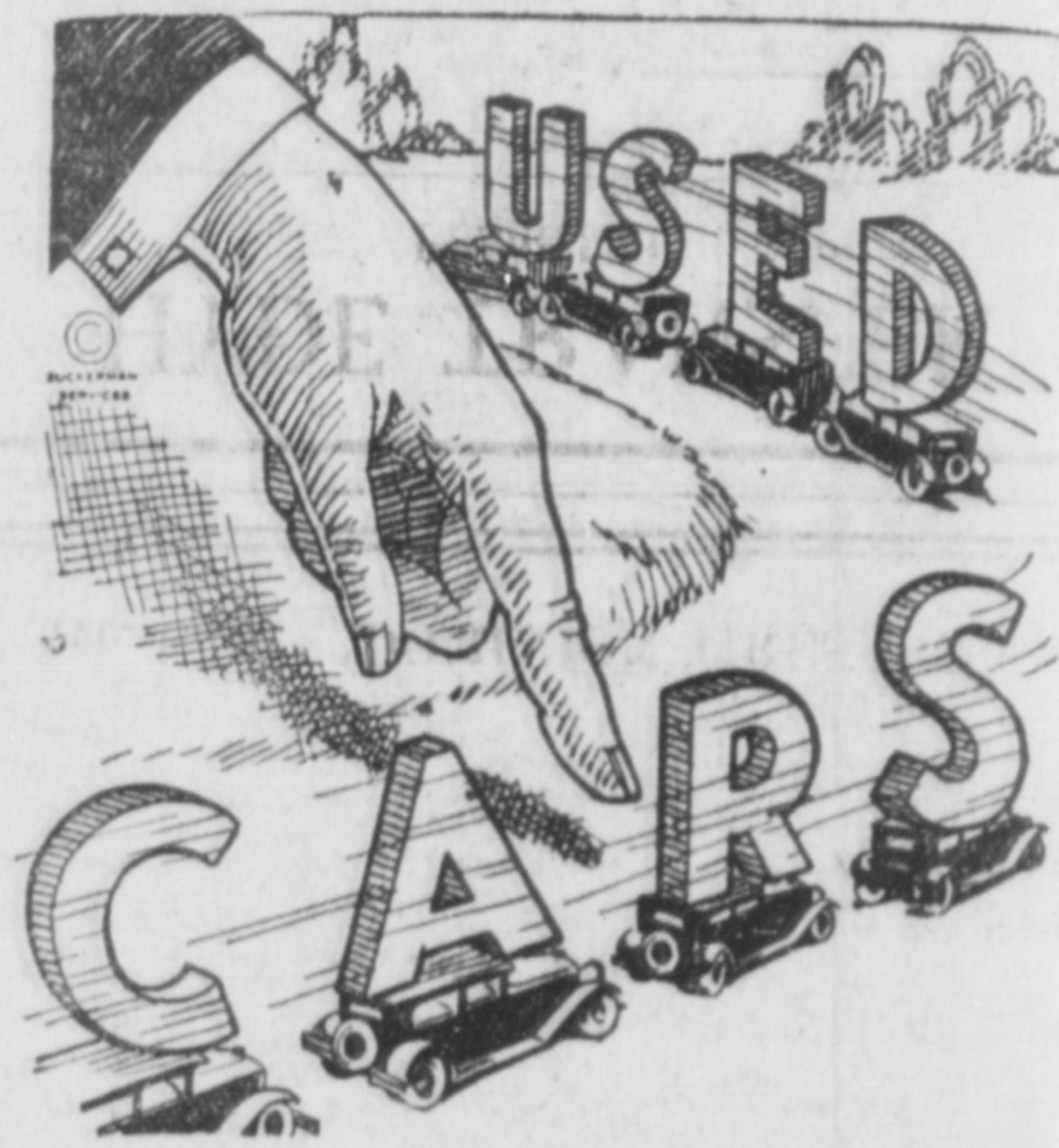
