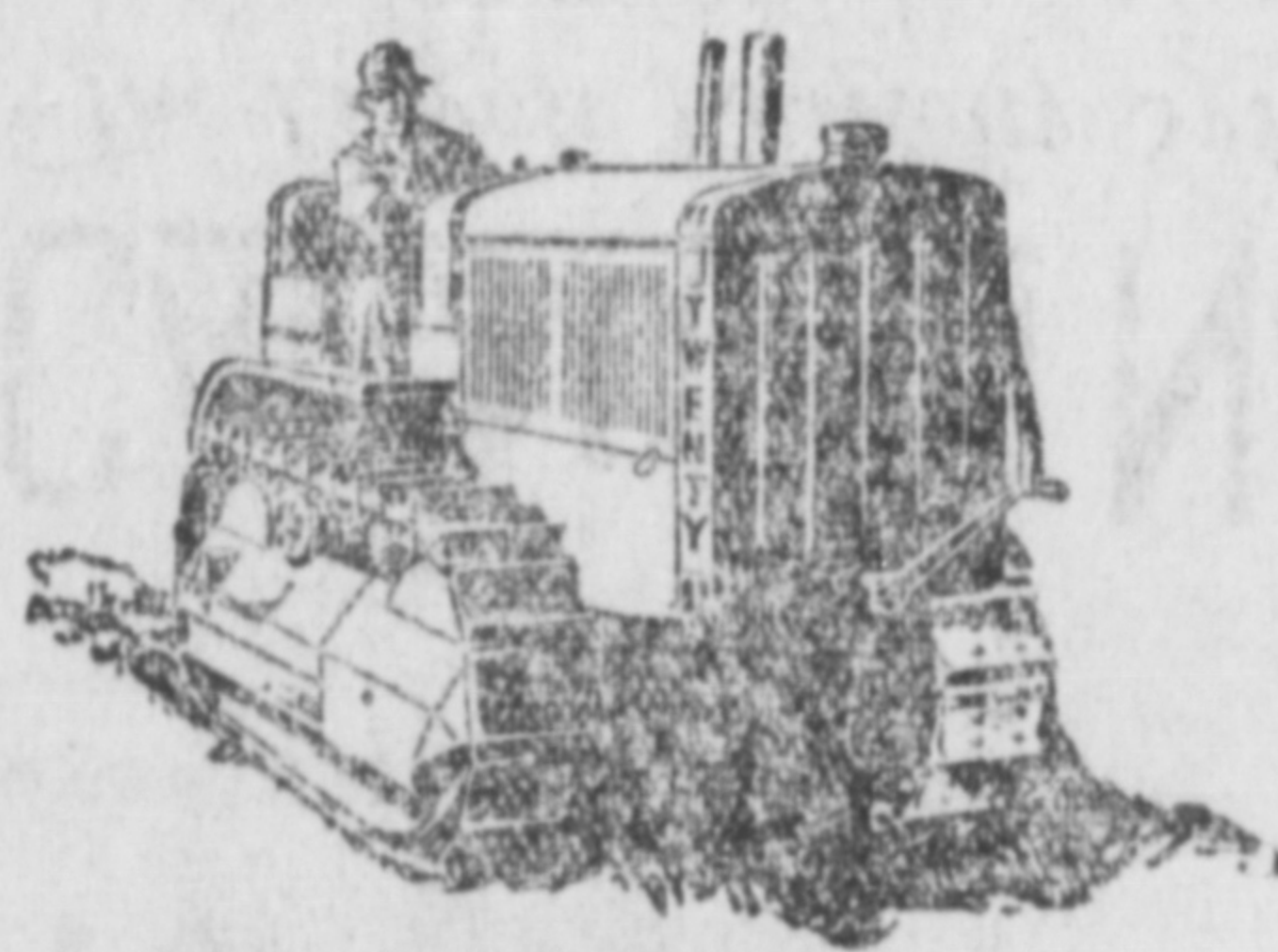

BETTER HERE

Some Fifty Men Now on Local Workless List Including Several Who Have Drifted In

There is a general improvement in the employment situation here, J. M. Campbell, superintendent of the local branch of the Employment Service of Canada, reports. The past week has been the best since the first of the year with steady demands for loggers on the coast, miners at Topley, section men on the railway and other casual jobs. Further improvement is looked for next month when industries should begin to open up generally.

There are some fifty men on the unemployment list now including a number who have drifted in recently from outside points.

TERRACE PEOPLE ASKING MORE OF BRITISH TROOPS IN EMERGENCIES QUICK TO ACT

Disappointment Expressed at the Small Amount to Be Expended on Roads of District

TERRACE, April 27.—A special meeting of the council of the Terrace Board of Trade was called on Tuesday evening to hear the report of the committee which met the new assistant district engineer, W. H. Cotten, of Smithers, on his recent visit here to discuss with him the public works requirements of the district. J. K. Gordon and T. M. Turner both presented reports and both expressed themselves as being disappointed with the interviews. The engineer had proved to be very non-committal and held out very little encouragement for much work being done here this summer and left the impression that a very small amount of the Skeena riding appropriation would be used here.

After much discussion, it was decided to write the district engineer in Prince Rupert asking for a definite statement as to the percentage of the appropriation which would be spent in the Terrace district and urging for at least one-third of the allocation. The opinion was freely expressed that roads in the Hazelton and Smithers districts were more numerous and in much better condition than here and that this end of the district had not had its share of the government money in the past.

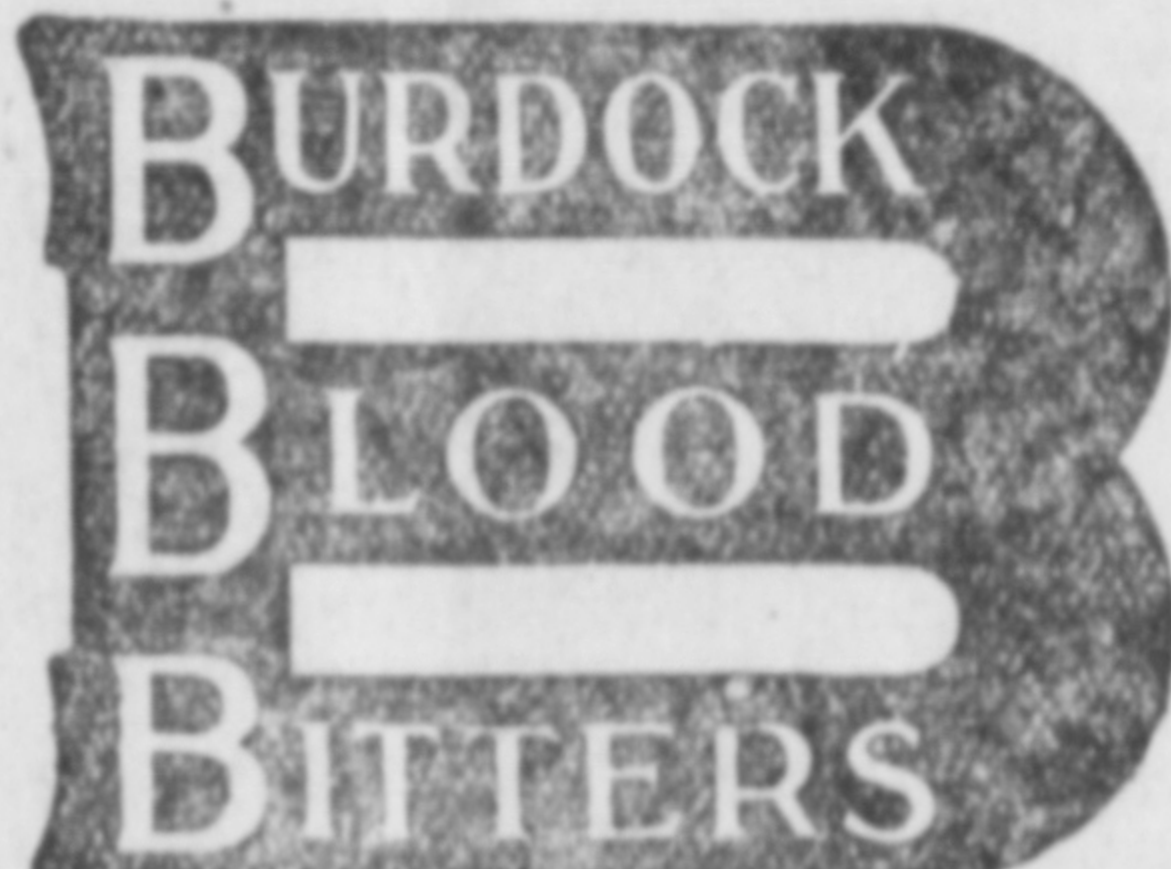
The committee reported that there was a likelihood of this district getting another grader and gravel truck.

The names of several new members were proposed and accepted.

The promptness with which the British army acts in emergencies is shown realistically in "Tommy Atkins," the big British production made in London and Egypt, that has its premier at the Capitol Theatre next week.

In the picture a British garrison is shown besieged in a desert fort by rebellious natives who are determined upon wiping out the small force defending the post. The garrison is surrounded and outnumbered but makes a gallant defence until there is only a handful of men left.

At this point a call is made for volunteers—a call for someone to go through the enemy lines and bring relief. Nearly every man in the place steps forward and offers to make the trip. One is chosen and is lowered over the fortifications.

Pursued by desert tribesmen, he makes his way through the enemy country and rides into the nearest garrison. Bugle sounds, troops rush into line and before the last notes of "Boots and Saddles" have died down the relief force is off. Fighting every mile of the way, the picture vividly portrays the entry of the force into the besieged post, only to find all but a single man dead.

"Who is in command here," asks the commander of the relief force.

A solitary figure rises from the wounded, steps forward, salutes and announces: "Tommy Atkins, sir!"

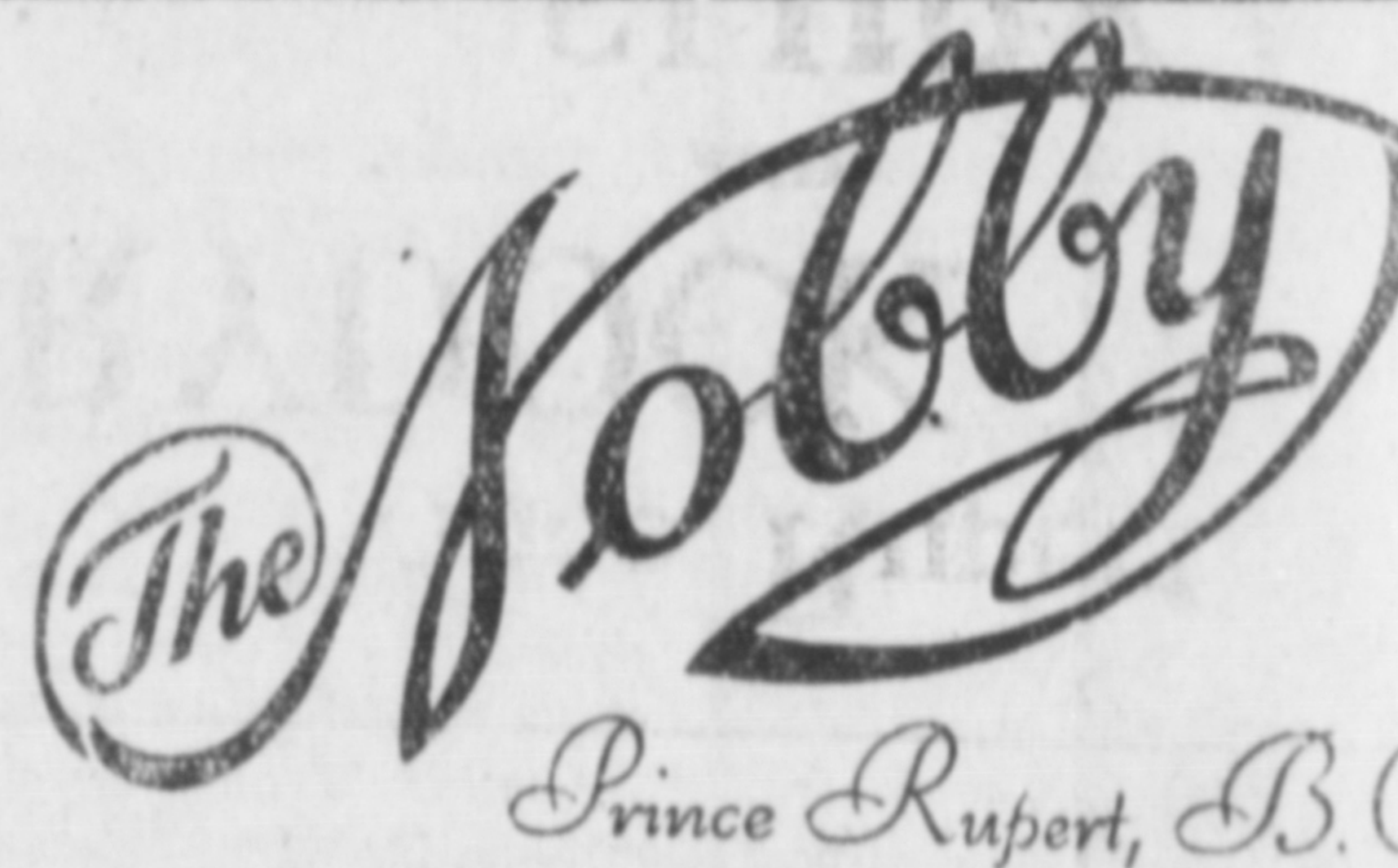
