With the discussion of the hold-up play fresh in his mind, he decided this was the place to use it. Accordingly the four of hearts was played from dummy, Mr. Champion played the queen and Mr. Muzzy followed with the ten.

Mr. Champion fired back the eight of hearts and Mr. Muzzy ducked again, playing the ten.

Mrs. Keen won with the king and returned a third heart, clearing the suit.

Now if Mr. Champion had the ace of clubs or if the hearts were split 4-4 between the East-West hands, the contract was safe.

So Mr. Muzzy laid down the four of clubs and leaned forward excitedly to see who had the ace. As you see, Mrs. Keen had it and she lost no time playing it. Her two good hearts defeated the contract.

Mr. Muzzy should have thought a little longer before playing to the first trick. His intermediate hearts (the jack and ten) gave him a certain second stopper in the suit, provided he played his ace on Mr. Champion's queen at Trick 1.

You've got to know when as well as how to use the hold-up. Never hold-up when the play will cost you a sure trick in the suit in question.

Clean Seed Is Important

PRINCE GEORGE—It is well known that weeds reduce yields by robbing the crop of valuable moisture and plant food, and increase the costs of cultivation, harvesting, threshing and marketing of grain. Weedy crops do not ripen evenly, and even after threshing, weed seeds tend to delay the drying of the grain. Cleaning the seed is the first step that should be taken towards the control of weeds, according to R. G. Savage of the experimental station at Prince George.

However, the removal of weeds is not the only reason for cleaning seed, says Mr. Savage. By proper cleaning, one can remove the small kernels, the cracked and shrunken seeds, and any trash or refuse, in North Central British Columbia, where the spring weather is often unfavourable to rapid crop development and the growing season is short, it is important to plant only seeds that are going to germinate quickly and produce vigorous plants. It is important to remove the light shrunken seeds because these will not produce as vigorous plants as will the large plump seeds. These weaker plants will be more dependent on favourable soil and climatic conditions to produce a satisfactory growth. The removal of cracked grain and trash is also important to ensure a uniform rate of seedling. When poorly cleaned grain is used for seed, the crop germinates irregularly, resulting in a patchy crop difficult to harvest because of uneven ripening.
