## Keeping Road Partly Open

Terrace to Exstew Only—Interior Board Talks Power and Phones

**TERRACE**—The Terrace and District Board of Trade meeting Wednesday night in the Credit Union hall with Alex Gillanders, this year's president in the chair, Mrs. Elsie Cooper was accepted as a new member and welcomed to the meetings.  
The Board was advised by Hon. E. T. Kenney that arrangements had been made to keep the highway between Terrace and Exstew open and special equipment would be sent from the south for the work. In the meantime, the work would be done by what machinery there is here.

A copy of a letter from Mr. Weston, of the B.C. Power Commission to the Premier was enclosed in a letter from Mr. Kenney to whom the Board had written concerning unsatisfactory power conditions here.

In the letter it was stated that the condition here was only a temporary one due to the non-arrival of the units. Terrace is to have one of the units from Queen's which is having a larger unit. However there has been a two months' delay in delivery of the unit to Queen's resulting in a delay in delivery of unit here. A letter of appreciation for his efforts on this matter is to be sent to Mr. Kenney, also acquainting him with the fact that there has been an inspection of the Kaim River Falls by parties interested in hydro power, for which it was stated there will be a demand for 25,000 h.p. Mr. Kenney, in his letter, advocated hydro power in the district.
