Using a floured sharp knife, cut dough into 2" lengths and place, well apart, on ungreased cookie sheets. Sprinkle rolls with cornmeal and let rise, uncovered, for 1/2 hour. Brush with cold water and let rise another 1/2 hour. Meanwhile, stand a broad shallow pan of hot water in the oven and preheat oven to hot, 425°. Remove pan of water from oven and bake the rolls in steam-filled oven for 1, hour, brushing them with cold water and sprinkling lightly with cornmeal after the first 15 mins and again brushing them with cold water 2 minutes before removing baked buns from the oven. Yield - 18 rolls.
