best interests of the community would not be served if their hospitals were operated by remote control.

"But," he continued, "the provincial government wants to help the hospitals in B.C. and is making a generous offer—far more generous than any other provincial government in Canada."

Mr. Turnbull said one-third of the cost of new construction would be advanced, as well as one-third of the cost of major repairs, and one-third of cost of equipment and furnishings of hospitals.

With this stood the federal government offer of \$1000 per bed for additional construction. "But without support of the community hospitals cannot be operated."

Mr. Turnbull referred briefly to B.C. Hospital Insurance System, which he said was started because it appeared the people of B.C. needed to share their hospital bills.

"Between 30 and 40 per cent of the people couldn't pay their bills. Hospitals everywhere had difficulty in operating. Some came very close to closing their doors."

The minister said that 500,000 accounts had been paid by BCHIS since 1949, totalling \$40,000,000. He said mistakes had been made in operation of BCHIS, "and will probably be made in the future," but advice would be taken from the legislative study board which had investigated hospital insurance in all parts of the province, and "hospital insurance will be tailored to meet the needs of the people."

"You have a good hospital here, but it needs renovation. I wish you every success in this new and very interesting way of getting the funds—and next year I hope to see the new boiler."

Mr. Turnbull lauded highly the work of Women's Auxiliary to hospitals throughout the province and said he could not see how hospitals could operate efficiently without such "invaluable assistance."

Mr. Applewhite spoke briefly, but created quite a stir when he stated that, after considerable research, it had been discovered that the first baby to be born in the Prince Rupert General Hospital was "a very popular member of the community—Joe Scott."

C. G. Ham, president of the hospital board, said two years ago the need was seen for capital funds for future operation of the hospital.

"After considerable study we have reached the conclusion that the present campaign is a way to get the funds is most likely to succeed."
