## Country's Safety Up To Young Men

Visiting Naval Officer  
Compliments HMCS Chatham

Commander J. M. Leeming, RCN, was high in his praise of both men and establishment at HMCS Chatham in an interview Monday. Cdr. Leeming is reserve training commander for the west coast, taking in the territory from Port Arthur to and including the coast.

He said he has been highly impressed with Prince Rupert, particularly by the members of the reserve division. He described them as "well built, conscientious citizens carrying out a duty with a purpose."

The division, he continued, offers young men naval training and an opportunity to train with the fleet at sea or courses at the Esquimalt naval schools.

Apart from training, Commander Leeming was impressed with the complete line of sports available at Chatham for reserves—sailing, boxing, skating, badminton, tennis, basketball, etc.

"It is quite evident," he said, "that the Democracies, with their struggle against Communism, will not be able to maintain forces of a size able to combat force with force. The answer, therefore, is a large reserve, well trained and efficient, ready to take its place with the permanent forces in times of emergency. With the naval service, this training takes many months to achieve efficiency."

HMCS Chatham, the commander continued, is equipped and ready to train all young men who respond to the challenge. "The Navy is not very easy," he said. "It is a hard life. But the old axiom, 'If a thing is worth having, it is worth working for,' holds."

The recent expansion in services as announced by the minister of national defence, he said, puts the onus of Canadian security on the shoulders of all young Canadians who are medically fit but unable to join the permanent service. "They have a clearly defined responsibility to their country to preserve our democratic way of life, which is more than at stake, by taking their places with the reserve forces of Canada in the crusade against the Communist aggressor."

Before coming here, Commander visited bases in the Maritimes, Toronto, London, Winnipeg, Port Arthur, Saskatoon, Edmonton, Calgary, Regina and Victoria.

He also visited universities across the prairies and expressed astonishment at how little university students knew of their own countries and current world affairs.




