

London Likes Fur Fabrics

LONDON (CP)—Five new materials with definite party appeal are a popular festive choice with London's Christmas shoppers.

They are ermaleen, minkaleen, oceleen, pershelle and beaverleem—new fur-fabric materials that look so good they are walking advertisements for the skins from which they take their name.

It would be impossible except at close quarters, to tell whether a toque beret, cravat and muff of white ermaleen, worn with a slim black suit, was not the real thing. Yet this threesome costs only £20 14s., can be bought separately, and has an undentable Mayfair look.

No garment made from these fabrics costs more than £25, and its appearance is striking and glamorous. A lovely contrast to black cocktail and evening gowns is the tuxedo jacket of white ermaleen with wide, lightly-uffed bell sleeves and swagger collar. Its close resemblance to ermine is heightened by a fringe of black-tipped tails to the neckline.

A tall-fringed minkaleen stole is a r.semble silverblu mink will add glamor to that silky, cocktail dress with bare shoulders at the moderate cost of £11. And a white ermaleen scarf would go well with a black tuxedo cocktail suit.

A pretty off-set for some of the new royal purples and honey blues is an elegant black, slingshaped cape of pershelle—looked for all the world like black Persian lamb and costing only 18s.

Useful for afternoon and evening wear are the waisted, slingshaped coats of silverblu mink.

Timely Recipe

- SHRIMP JAMBALAYA**
- 2 tablespoons fat
 - 1 tablespoon flour
 - 1/2 cup chopped onions
 - 1 clove garlic, minced fine
 - 1 cup canned tomatoes
 - 1/2 cup water
 - 1 green pepper, chopped fine
 - 1/2 teaspoon salt
 - 1/4 teaspoon red pepper
 - 1/4 teaspoon thyme
 - 1 tablespoon Worcestershire Sauce
 - 3 cups cooked rice
 - 2 cups cooked shrimp, cut in pieces

- 1 cup tomato juice
- 1/2 cup grated cheese
- 2 tablespoons parsley

Preparing Fluffy White Rice

To make 3 liberal cups of fluffy rice: pit 1 cup of uncooked rice, 2 cups of cold water and 1 teaspoon of salt in a two-quart saucepan and cover with a tight fitting lid. Bring to a vigorous boil and then turn the heat as low as possible—leave over this low heat for 14 minutes. Turn off the heat. This cooking time results in firm grains of cooked rice. (For extra tender grains, allow the rice to steam (with heat off) for an additional 5 minutes before removing the lid.)

Never remove the lid nor stir rice while it is cooking. After rice is cooked, remove lid, lift rice gently with fork to allow steam to escape to the desired consistency. It is then ready.

METHOD: Melt fat in skillet, add flour and blend thoroughly. Add the onions and cook until the onions are tender. Add garlic, tomatoes, water, green pepper, salt, red pepper, thyme, Worcestershire sauce. Cook until pepper is tender. Stir occasionally. Add rice, shrimp and tomato juice. Pour into a greased baking dish. Sprinkle the cheese and parley over the top. Place in a 350° F. oven for 15 minutes. This recipe makes six servings.

For those who like the piquant French look, an aceleen waistcoat, muff and beret can be combined with tight-skirted suit having lapel and pocket braiding. Although fur imitations have been tried many times, the worst offenders being ocelot and leopard fabrics, the latest weaves are the best of their kind yet to hit the market. Finest example is the black pershelle, and white ermaleen runs an easy second.

The materials are especially useful for linings of travel coats and rainproofs. They mean warmth without excessive price.
