**Importance Tends
 To Dignified Demeanor.**

The Pacific Coast is much in the eye of the world today. It is the point where business is going to boom, where new problems will be settled, where the danger point lies, the meeting point between East and West. The people who live on the coast are assuming a new importance in world events.

Prince Rupert will share in the growing importance of all coast points. Already she is feeling the change and within a few years the change will be much more strongly marked. The growing importance of the city must make us all grow bigger both in our dealings with the outside world and with each other. We can well afford to avoid pettiness and to replace it with a broad tolerance such as becomes those who can afford to be dignified. We shall soon leave the village era behind and blossom out into a town or, as we call it here, a city.

**Archbishop on
 Family Life.**

The true principle of democracy can be best learnt in the home. Experience in family life is not simply the best preparation for citizenship in the larger community, but it is the actual beginning of the social life which is essentially one, whether the sphere be the family, the community, the nation, or the world. More than this, the social life is essentially one with the religious life. Our Heavenly Father loves all His earthly children. His spirit dwells in the souls of all in such a way that we cannot love the Infinite Father without loving His children, and we cannot love His children in any genuine sense unless this be in the active sense of promoting good relationship with all—in other words, social welfare. It is this recognition of the practical unity between the social and the religious life which will help more than anything else to bring religion into every nook and corner of our daily life, especially our home life.

As this article is being written, a little girl is mothering a doll near by. The parental instinct is divine. It is a fragment of the love of God. The spirit of service is part of the spirit of Christ, and it must take the form of social service, first in the home, then in the community in ever widening circles. True democracy must finally embrace the whole family of God. Viewed in this light, a fresh halo of glory encircles the earthly home, the place where the great truth that we are all ministering members of society is first learnt. It is necessary, however, that an intelligent application of the principle of democracy should be made in the home. The welfare of the whole family should be the foundation of all rule and authority. When the head of the house recognizes this authority over him as the authority of God, who will the welfare of all, we have the beginning of true religion. The children should early learn the difference between this and a false autocracy which has in it all the elements of tyranny. The welfare of the whole society involves the welfare of each part, and the Government is only a means to promote the welfare of the whole society—not an end in itself for which society exists. "Helping father" is the first infantile step towards social service which the boy makes in the family. "Helping the Heavenly Father" to promote the welfare of all His children is the first step towards true religion, which must never be confused with a selfish seeking for safety first.
