




Due to changes in entries—two cancellations from the Prince Rupert Little Theatre and one from Booth-Memorial High School plays, the program committee is re-making the stencils. There were also late entries from the district.

Mrs. J. S. Black, president of the local Little Theatre, said that the royalty companies would not allow part production of their spring play to be presented at the festival.

The second entry from the Little Theatre, a one-act drama, had to be cancelled due to the inability to get a director for the production.

discussed, with some anxiety being expressed by the executive as to the response being shown. Distribution of tickets was


