## Elk Cagers Down Mansons In Pace Setting Tangle

A hard-fought hoop battle Saturday night gave another edge to the Elks in senior league basketball as Alex Bill's cagers chalked up their third win in as many games this season.

TORONTO (C)—Hamilton Tiger Cats squeezed through to the Big Four football final Saturday past the fiercely battling Toronto Argonaut machine that faded from the Grey Cup race in glorious fashion.

Saturday's games saw two championships decided. Sarnia winning the Ontario Rugby Football Union senior crown and University of Toronto the intercollegiate.

The Sarnia Imperials brushed off Toronto onto Ealmy Beach 26 to 7 to move into the Eastern Canada final title against the Big Four champions—Ottawa or Hamilton.

University of Toronto climaxed one of its best seasons in history by winning the senior intercollegiate title, beating McGill University Redmen 11 to 7.

The Wilkes Queens went down 20 to 13 against University of Western Ontario.

The Argos trampled the Bengals 21 to 7 but bowed out 31-28 on home and home total points in the semi-final round.

The Tiger Cats got their edge with a 24 to 7 slush and ice first game victory at Toronto last Wednesday.

When the smoke of battle has cleared in the East, the winners will meet Saskatchewan Rough Riders in the Grey Cup final.

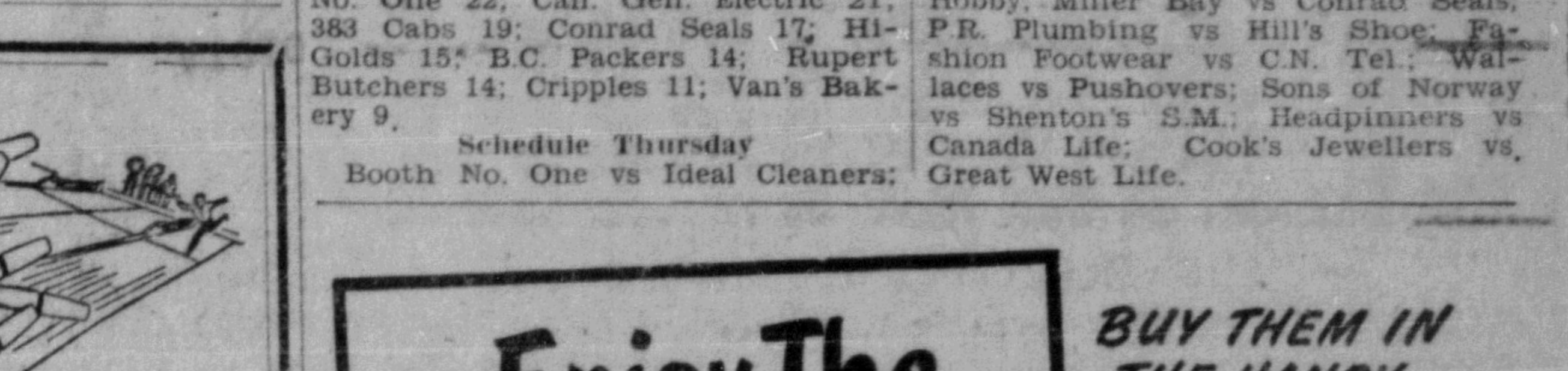
For the ladies in this section, Irene Mustad gained high average of 169 for the lead and also rolled a high single of 239. Jan Jensen took high three honor with 591.
